- SECTION 1. Chapter 63, Acts of the 43rd Legislature, 1st 6
- Called Session, 1933, is amended by adding Section 13C to read as 7
- follows: 8
- 9 Sec. 13C. (a) In this section:
- (1) "Canal system" means the canal system and 10
- 11 associated properties generally known as the Devers Canal System.
- 12 (2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on
- Environmental Quality. 13
- (3) "Navigation district" means the Chambers-Liberty 14
- Counties Navigation District. 15
- 16 (b) The district may:
- (1) acquire, own, operate, maintain, and improve the 17
- canal system; and 18
- 19 (2) enlarge and extend the canal system east of the
- Trinity River in Chambers, Liberty, and Jefferson Counties. 20
- 21 (c) The district may own the water rights and appropriate
- and divert water of this state under the permits and contracts 22
- previously owned by and acquired from the Devers Canal Rice 23
- 24 Producers Association, Inc.

- 1 (d) Except as provided by Subsection (e) of this section,
- 2 the district may distribute, sell, and use water of this state for
- 3 any purpose approved by the commission.
- 4 (e) Before entering into a contract to sell or provide water
- 5 for any use other than irrigation in Chambers County outside the
- 6 district's boundaries that the navigation district had authority to
- 7 provide or sell under the navigation district's water rights on
- 8 May 1, 2009, the district must:
- 9 (1) send to the navigation district a written notice
- 10 of intent to sell or provide water for nonirrigation use in Chambers
- 11 County outside the district's boundaries; and
- 12 (2) allow the navigation district 30 days to exercise
- 13 a right of first refusal to provide the water.
- 14 (f) Not later than the 30th day after the date the
- 15 navigation district receives the notice of intent under Subsection
- 16 (e) of this section, the navigation district may exercise its right
- 17 of first refusal under Subsection (e) of this section by delivering
- 18 to the district notice that it intends to exercise that right.
- 19 (g) The district may enter into a contract described by
- 20 Subsection (e) of this section only if the navigation district:
- 21 (1) fails to comply with Subsection (f) of this
- 22 <u>section; or</u>
- (2) complies with Subsection (f) of this section and
- 24 does not enter into a contract to sell or otherwise provide water
- 25 for the use described by the district's notice of intent under

- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
