4	SECTION 1. Title 12, Business & Commerce Code, as effective
5	April 1, 2009, is amended by adding Chapter 606 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 606. FREE TRIAL OFFERS OF CONSUMER GOODS OR SERVICES
7	Sec. 606.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "consumer"
8	means a person who obtains a good or service that is to be used
9	primarily for personal, family, or household purposes.
10	Sec. 606.002. REQUIREMENTS AND PROHIBITIONS RELATING TO
11	TRIAL OFFERS OF GOODS OR SERVICES. (a) This section applies only to
12	a person that offers a consumer free goods or services on a trial
13	basis and that, at the end of the free trial period, charges the
14	consumer a fee, including a periodic fee, for the goods or services.
15	(b) A person to whom this section applies must send to a
16	consumer who accepts the goods or services a form that the consumer
17	may use to indicate the consumer's agreement to pay the fee after
18	the end of the free trial period.
19	(c) A person to whom this section applies may not charge a
20	fee for the goods or services after the end of the free trial period
21	if the person does not receive a signed form from the consumer in
22	which the consumer agrees to pay the fee after the end of the free
23	trial period.
24	(d) A violation of this section is a deceptive trade

- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 606, Business & Commerce Code, as added
- 4 by this Act, applies only to an offer to provide goods and services

- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- $7\,$ a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
