## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of a statewide meet and confer
- 3 provision pertaining to employment matters for certain state and
- 4 local public safety personnel.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 617.002, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d) and other law, an
- 10 [An] official of the state or of a political subdivision of the
- 11 state may not enter into a collective bargaining contract with a
- 12 labor organization regarding wages, hours, or conditions of
- 13 employment of public employees.
- 14 (d) This section does not apply to a labor organization
- 15 representing the law enforcement officers, firefighters, or
- 16 emergency medical services personnel in a municipality with a
- 17 population of more than 5,000, or to a labor organization
- 18 representing law enforcement officers employed by a state agency.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 617, Government Code, is amended by
- 20 adding Section 617.006 to read as follows:
- Sec. 617.006. COLLECTIVE BARGAINING BY STATE AGENCIES AND
- 22 <u>IN CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES.</u> (a) A state agency or a municipality
- 23 with a population of 5,000 or more may establish by rule a fair and
- 24 efficient collective bargaining system that conforms to the

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- 1 requirements of federal law and negotiate with labor organizations
- 2 representing law enforcement officers, firefighters, or emergency
- 3 medical services personnel to enter into a collective bargaining
- 4 agreement. The state agency or municipality may adopt or use as a
- 5 guide any civil service law or rule of the United States, this
- 6 state, or a political subdivision in this state to the extent that
- 7 the law or rule promotes the purposes of this chapter and is
- 8 consistent with the needs and circumstances of the state agency or
- 9 municipality.
- 10 (b) This section does not apply to any group of law
- 11 enforcement officers, firefighters, or emergency medical services
- 12 personnel who are already covered by an existing meet and confer or
- 13 collective bargaining law that conforms with federal minimum
- 14 requirements.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
