## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the retrieval and waste of game birds, game animals, and

- 3 fish; providing a penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 62.011, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsection
- 7 (d) to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), it is an offense
- 9 if a person intentionally takes or possesses a game bird, game
- 10 animal, or [a] fish and intentionally, knowingly, [or] recklessly,
- 11 or with criminal negligence  $[\tau]$  fails to keep the edible portions of
- 12 the bird, animal, or fish in an edible condition.
- 13 (c) It is an offense if a person while hunting kills or
- 14 wounds a desert bighorn sheep, pronghorn antelope, mule deer, or
- 15 white-tailed deer in violation of Section 61.022, 62.003, 62.0031,
- 16 62.004, or 62.005 and intentionally or knowingly fails to make a
- 17 reasonable effort to retrieve the animal or intentionally,
- 18 knowingly, [ex] recklessly, or with criminal negligence fails to
- 19 keep the edible parts of the animal in an edible condition.
- 20 (d) In this section:
- 21 (1) "Edible condition" means fit for human
- 22 consumption. The term does not include any portion of a game bird,
- 23 game animal, or fish that is:
- (A) bruised by bullet, shot, or arrow, or

- 1 otherwise destroyed as a result of harvest;
- 2 (B) decayed or rotting; or
- 3 <u>(C) obviously infected or diseased.</u>
- 4 (2) "Edible parts" means the meaty portions of a
- 5 carcass that are retained for consumption after quartering as
- 6 defined in Section 42.001(8).
- 7 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 10 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed. For
- 11 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 12 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 13 before that date.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
