4	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
5	Subchapter I-1 to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER I-1. PHYSICIAN RESIDENCY GRANTS
7	Sec. 61.511. PHYSICIAN RESIDENCY GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The
8	board shall establish and administer the physician residency grant
9	program to provide grants to eligible residency programs at health
10	care entities, including nonprofit community hospitals, county
11	health systems, and community health clinics, that apply to the
12	board in the manner prescribed by the board.
13	(b) The board may provide grants only to support physician
14	<pre>residency programs for:</pre>
15	<pre>(1) family practice;</pre>
16	(2) pediatrics;
17	(3) psychiatry; or
18	(4) internal medicine.
19	(c) The board shall award grants based on:
20	(1) the residency program's history of placing
21	residents in underserved communities after the residency program is
22	<pre>completed; and</pre>
23	(2) the amount of matching funding a residency program
24	will receive from community collaborative groups.

- 2 section may be used only to pay the salaries of resident physicians
- 3 in the appropriate programs in an amount of not more than \$65,000
- 4 for each resident in a year.
- 5 (e) The grant program may provide funding for not more than

- 7 (f) The board shall adopt rules for the administration of
- 8 this section.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
