BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Sections 1131.053(a) and (d), Insurance Code, 5 are amended to read as follows:

6 (a) group life insurance policy that insures А the employers' employees or the unions' members for the benefit of 7 persons other than the employers or unions may be issued to the 8 trustees of a fund established or adopted by two or more employers 9 in the same industry or by one or more labor unions, by one or more 10 11 employers in the same industry and one or more labor unions, or by 12 one or more employers and one or more labor unions whose members are in the same or related occupations or trades. 13

14 (d) A policy may not be issued under this section to insure 15 employees of:

16 (1) an employer whose eligibility to participate in 17 the fund as an employer arises out of considerations directly 18 related to the employer being a commercial correspondent or 19 business client or patron of another employer, without regard to 20 whether the other employer participates in the fund; or

21 (2) an employer that is not located in this state, 22 unless:

(A) the majority of the employers whose employees
are to be insured are located in this state; or

C.S.H.B. No. 2690 (B) the policy is issued to the trustees of a fund 2 established <u>or adopted</u> by one or more labor unions.

3 SECTION 2. This Act applies only to an insurance policy or 4 contract or evidence of coverage that is delivered, issued for 5 delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2010. An insurance 6 policy or contract or evidence of coverage delivered, issued for 7 delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2010, is governed by the law 8 as it existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and 9 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
