## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of plumbers.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 1301.002, Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 by amending Subdivisions (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (8), (9), and
- 6 (10), and adding Subdivision (9-a) to read as follows:
- 7 (2) "Drain cleaner" means a person who:
- 8 (A) has completed at least 4,000 hours working
- 9 under the supervision of a master plumber as a drain
- 10 cleaner-restricted registrant;
- 11 (B) has fulfilled the requirements of and is
- 12 registered with the board; and
- 13 (C) installs cleanouts and removes and resets
- 14 p-traps to eliminate obstructions in building drains and sewers
- 15 under the supervision of a responsible master plumber.
- 16 (3) "Drain cleaner-restricted registrant" means a
- 17 person who:
- 18 (A) has worked as a plumber's apprentice under
- 19 the supervision of a master plumber;
- 20 (B) has fulfilled the requirements of and is
- 21 registered with the board; and
- (C) clears obstructions in sewer and drain lines
- 23 through any code-approved existing opening under the supervision of
- 24 a responsible master plumber.

- 1 (4) "Journeyman plumber" means a person licensed under
- 2 this chapter who:
- 3 (A) has met the qualifications for registration
- 4 as a plumber's apprentice or for licensing as a tradesman
- 5 plumber-limited license holder;
- 6 (B) has completed at least 8,000 hours working
- 7 under the supervision of a master plumber;
- 8 (C) installs, changes, repairs, services, or
- 9 renovates plumbing or supervises any of those activities under the
- 10 <u>supervision of a responsible master plumber</u>; and
- 11 (D) has passed the required examination and
- 12 fulfilled the other requirements of the board.
- 13 (5) "Master plumber" means a person licensed under
- 14 this chapter who:
- 15 (A) is skilled in the planning and superintending
- 16 of plumbing and in the practical installation, repair, and
- 17 servicing of plumbing;
- 18 (B) [secures permits for plumbing work;
- 19  $\left[\frac{(C)}{C}\right]$  is knowledgeable about the codes,
- 20 ordinances, or rules governing the activities described by
- 21 Paragraph [Paragraphs] (A) [and (B)];
- (C)[<del>(D)</del>] performs or supervises plumbing work;
- 23 and
- (D) [(E)] has passed the required examination and
- 25 fulfilled the other requirements of the board.
- 26 (6) "Plumber's apprentice" means a person other than a
- 27 master plumber, journeyman plumber, or tradesman plumber-limited

- 1 license holder who, as the person's principal occupation, learns
- 2 about and assists in the installation of plumbing, has fulfilled
- 3 the requirements of and is registered by the board, and works under
- 4 the supervision of a responsible master plumber and the direct
- 5 supervision of a licensed plumber.
- 6 (8) "Plumbing inspector" means a person who:
- 7 (A) is employed by a <u>state agency or political</u>
- 8 subdivision, or contracts as an independent contractor with a state
- 9 agency or political subdivision, to inspect plumbing in connection
- 10 with health and safety laws, including ordinances, and plumbing and
- 11 gas codes; and
- 12 (B) has passed the required examination and
- 13 fulfilled the other requirements of the board.
- 14 (9) "Residential utilities installer" means a person
- 15 who:
- 16 (A) has completed at least 2,000 hours working
- 17 under the supervision of a master plumber as a plumber's
- 18 apprentice;
- 19 (B) has fulfilled the requirements of and is
- 20 registered with the board; and
- 21 (C) constructs and installs yard water service
- 22 piping for one-family or two-family dwellings and building sewers
- 23 under the supervision of a responsible master plumber.
- 24 (9-a) "Responsible master plumber" means a person
- 25 licensed as a master plumber under this chapter who:
- 26 (A) allows the person's master plumber license to
- 27 be used by one plumbing company for the purpose of offering and

- 1 performing plumbing work under the person's master plumber license;
- 2 (B) is authorized to obtain permits for plumbing
- 3 work;
- 4 (C) assumes responsibility for plumbing work
- 5 performed under the person's license; and
- 6 (D) has submitted a certificate of insurance as
- 7 required by Section 1301.3576.
- 8 (10) "Tradesman plumber-limited license holder" means
- 9 a person who:
- 10 (A) has completed at least 4,000 hours working
- 11 under the direct supervision of a journeyman or master plumber as a
- 12 plumber's apprentice;
- 13 (B) has passed the required examination and
- 14 fulfilled the other requirements of the board; and
- 15 (C) constructs and installs plumbing for
- 16 one-family or two-family dwellings under the supervision of a
- 17 responsible master plumber [; and
- 18 [(D) has not met or attempted to meet the
- 19 qualifications for a journeyman plumber license].
- 20 SECTION 2. Section 1301.302, Occupations Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1301.302. CONTRACT INFORMATION. A written proposal,
- 23 <u>invoice</u>, or contract <u>relating to</u> [<del>for</del>] plumbing services [<del>to be</del>]
- 24 performed by or under the direction of a plumber licensed under this
- 25 chapter must contain the name and license number of the responsible
- 26 master plumber and the name, mailing address, and telephone number
- 27 of the board.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 1301.351, Occupations Code, is amended
- 2 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2)
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 (a) A person, other than a responsible master plumber, may
- 5 not engage in [the business of] plumbing unless:
- 6 (1) the person holds the proper [a] license,
- 7 <u>registration</u>, or endorsement <u>required by</u> [<del>or is registered under</del>]
- 8 this chapter; and [<del>or</del>]
- 9 (2) the person's work is supervised and controlled by a
- 10 person licensed under this chapter.
- 11 <u>(a-1)</u> A person may not act as a responsible master plumber
- 12 unless the person holds the appropriate license and meets the
- 13 requirements for a responsible master plumber under this chapter.
- 14 (a-2) A person that advertises or otherwise offers to
- 15 perform or provide plumbing must secure the services of a
- 16 <u>responsible master plumber.</u>
- SECTION 4. Section 1301.356(e), Occupations Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (e) A plumbing inspector who meets the requirements of the
- 20 board may hold a medical gas endorsement and inspect medical gas
- 21 piping installations.
- SECTION 5. Section 1301.3576, Occupations Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1301.3576. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE FOR RESPONSIBLE
- 25 MASTER PLUMBER. When a person is issued a master plumber's license,
- 26 the person must provide the board with a certificate of insurance
- 27 that meets the requirements of Section 1301.552 before the person

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- 1 works as a responsible master plumber.
- 2 SECTION 6. Section 1301.451(a), Occupations Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) The board shall revoke, suspend, deny, or refuse to
- 5 renew a license, endorsement, or registration or shall reprimand a
- 6 holder of a license, endorsement, or registration for a violation
- 7 of this chapter, an order issued by the board, or a rule of the
- 8 board.
- 9 SECTION 7. Section 1301.452(a), Occupations Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) A person is subject to disciplinary action under Section
- 12 1301.451 if the person violates this chapter, an order issued by the
- 13 board, or a board rule. A violation of this chapter includes:
- 14 (1) obtaining a license, endorsement, or registration
- 15 through error or fraud;
- 16 (2) wilfully, negligently, or arbitrarily violating a
- 17 municipal rule or ordinance that regulates sanitation, drainage, or
- 18 plumbing;
- 19 (3) making a misrepresentation of services provided or
- 20 to be provided; [or]
- 21 (4) making a false promise with the intent to induce a
- 22 person to contract for a service; or
- 23 (5) employing a person who does not hold a license or
- 24 endorsement or who is not registered to engage in an activity for
- 25 which a license, endorsement, or registration is required under
- 26 this chapter.
- 27 SECTION 8. Section 1301.504, Occupations Code, is amended

- 1 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 2 (d) Venue for an action brought under this section is in a
- 3 <u>district court in Travis County.</u>
- 4 SECTION 9. Section 1301.5045(a), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The executive director [If it appears to the board that
- 7 a person is violating this chapter or a rule adopted under this
- 8 chapter, the board, after notice and opportunity for a hearing,
- 9 may issue a cease and desist order as necessary to enforce this
- 10 chapter if the executive director determines that the action is
- 11 necessary to prevent a violation of this chapter and to protect
- 12 public health and safety [prohibiting the person from engaging in
- 13 the activity].
- 14 SECTION 10. Section 1301.707, Occupations Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 1301.707. OPTIONS FOLLOWING DECISION: PAY OR APPEAL.
- 17 (a) Not later than the 30th day after the date the board's order
- 18 becomes final, the person shall:
- 19 (1) pay the penalty; or
- 20 (2) file a petition for judicial review contesting the
- 21 occurrence of the violation, the amount of the penalty, or both.
- (b) Failure by the person to pay the penalty is grounds for
- 23 the board to refuse to renew the person's license or registration
- 24 and to refuse to issue a new license or registration to the person.
- 25 SECTION 11. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to
- 26 Sections 1301.451 and 1301.452, Occupations Code, apply to a
- 27 violation that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. A

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- 1 violation that occurs before the effective date of this Act is
- 2 governed by the law in effect on the date of the violation, and the
- 3 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 (b) The change in law made by this Act to Section 1301.504,
- 5 Occupations Code, applies to an action commenced on or after the
- 6 effective date of this Act. An action commenced before the
- 7 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 8 date the action was commenced, and the former law is continued in
- 9 effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
