A written proposal or contract relating to [for] plumbing services [to be] performed by or under the direction of a plumber licensed under this chapter must contain the name and license number of the responsible master plumber and the name, mailing address, and telephone number of the board.

SECTION 3. Section 1301.351, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to read as follows:

A person, other than a responsible master plumber, may (a) not engage in [the business of] plumbing unless:

(1) the person holds the proper [<del>a</del>] license registration, or endorsement required by [or is registered under]

(2) the person's work is supervised and controlled by a person licensed under this chapter.

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3-1 MASTER PLUMBER. When a person is issued a master plumber's license, the person must provide the board with a certificate of insurance 3-2 3-3 that meets the requirements of Section 1301.552 before the person 3 - 4works as a responsible master plumber. 3**-**5

A violation that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date of the violation, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

The change in law made by this Act to Section 1301.504, (b) Occupations Code, applies to an action commenced on or after the effective date of this Act. An action commenced before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the action was commenced, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
