5	SECTION 1. Section 301.002, Occupations Code, is amended by
6	adding Subdivision (6) to read as follows:
7	(6) "Certified nurse aide" means a person who holds a
8	certificate of registration issued under this chapter as a
9	certified nurse aide.
10	SECTION 2. Section 301.151, Occupations Code, is amended to
11	read as follows:
12	Sec. 301.151. GENERAL RULEMAKING AUTHORITY. The board may
13	adopt and enforce rules consistent with this chapter and necessary
14	to:
15	(1) perform its duties and conduct proceedings before
16	the board;
17	(2) regulate the practice of professional nursing and
18	vocational nursing <u>and the practice of certified nurse aides</u> ;
19	(3) establish standards of professional conduct for
20	license <u>and certificate</u> holders under this chapter; [ <del>and</del> ]
21	(4) determine the scope of practice for certified
22	nurse aides; and
23	(5) determine whether an act constitutes the practice
24	of professional nursing or vocational nursing or the practice of

Section 301.157, Occupations Code, is amended by 3 adding Subsection (i) to read as follows: 4 (i) The board by rule shall: 5 (1) prescribe a program of study to qualify a person 6 for an initial certificate of registration as a certified nurse 7 aide; and 8 (2) approve training programs that meet the board's requirements for the program of study. 9 10 SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 301.1596 to read as follows: 11 12 Sec. 301.1596. CERTIFIED NURSE AIDE ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The board shall establish a certified nurse aide advisory 13 (a) 14 committee to advise the board on the regulation of certified nurse 15 <u>aides.</u> (b) The advisory committee consists of at least 13 members 16 17 appointed by the executive director as follows: (1) two nursing home representatives; 18 19 (2) two representatives from community colleges with certified nurse aide training programs in this state; 20 21 (3) one hospital representative; 2.2 (4) one home health industry representative; (5) three certified nurse aides, two with not more 23 24 than five years' experience as certified nurse aides and one with at least five years' experience as a certified nurse aide; 25 26 (6) two representatives of certified nurse aide training programs that are not conducted by a facility described by 27

1 Section 250.001, Health and Safety Code, or a community college; 2 (7) one registered nurse with at least two years' 3 experience in training certified nurse aides; and 4 (8) one licensed vocational nurse with at least two 5 years' experience in working directly with certified nurse aides. 6 (c) The nurse aide advisory committee shall study and 7 provide recommendations to the board in the manner required by the 8 commissioner on: 9 (1) improving communication between nurses and 10 certified nurse aides; (2) clarifying the scope of practice of certified 11 12 nurse aides; (3) clarifying the professional relationship between 13 14 nurses and certified nurse aides; 15 (4) improving the practice of certified nurse aides; 16 (5) improving the training for certified nurse aides 17 to more adequately meet the state health care system's acute and long-term care demands; 18 19 (6) establishing the program of study and classroom hours required for successful completion of a certified nurse aide 20 21 training program; (7) listing the subjects to be included in the 22 training program curriculum to ensure the curriculum's continued 23 24 relevancy in health care, including consideration of curriculum 25 related to: 26 (A) successful strategies for dealing with patients with dementia or other difficult patients; 27

2	(C) task prioritizing;
3	(D) interpersonal communication skills;
4	(E) cultural sensitivity;
5	(F) teamwork training;
6	(G) pyschosocial skills; and
7	(H) the aging process; and
8	(8) establishing the examination requirements for
9	issuance of a certificate of registration as a certified nurse aide
10	and for inclusion on the nurse aide registry.
11	(d) A member of the advisory committee is entitled to
12	reimbursement for travel expenses incurred for service on the
13	advisory committee as provided by the General Appropriations Act. A
14	member may not receive any compensation for that service.
15	(e) The advisory committee shall meet regularly as
16	necessary at the call of the presiding officer of the advisory
17	committee or at the call of the executive director.
18	(f) The board shall provide administrative support for the
19	advisory committee.
20	(g) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
21	advisory committee established under this section.
22	SECTION 5. Subchapter D, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is
23	amended by adding Section 301.168 to read as follows:
24	Sec. 301.168. INTERAGENCY CONTRACT. (a) The board shall
25	enter into an interagency contract with the Health and Human
26	Services Commission and the Department of Aging and Disability
27	Services under which the board shall administer and maintain the

1	nurse aide registry established under Chapter 250, Health and
2	Safety Code.
3	(b) The interagency contract must provide that:
4	(1) the Department of Aging and Disability Services
5	has oversight authority over the nurse aide registry established
6	under Chapter 250, Health and Safety Code;
7	(2) the department is the only state agency authorized
8	to place findings of abuse, neglect, or exploitation in the
9	registry as prescribed by federal law;
10	(3) the board shall administer and maintain the daily
11	operation of the registry and receive the necessary federal funding
12	from the department to reimburse the board for the duties performed
13	by the board; and
14	(4) the department is responsible for reimbursement
15	provided to nursing home providers for the cost of certified nurse
16	aide training at the provider's facilities.
17	SECTION 6. Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is amended by

21	Sec. 301.281. CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION REQUIRED. (a) A
22	person may not engage in practice as a certified nurse aide or hold
23	out to the public that the person is a certified nurse aide or is
24	included on the nurse aide registry under Chapter 250, Health and
25	Safety Code, unless the person holds a certificate of registration
26	as a certified nurse aide under this chapter and is included on the
27	nurse aide registry under Chapter 250.

No. 2718 (b) The board, in consultation with the nurse aide advisory 1 2 committee established under Section 301.1596, by rule shall: (1) define the scope of practice of a certified nurse 3 4 aide; and 5 (2) establish the qualifications for holding a certificate of registration as a certified nurse aide and for 6 7 inclusion on the nurse aide registry. 8 (c) The qualifications established by the board must require a person applying to hold a certificate of registration as a 9 certified nurse aide and to be included on the nurse aide registry 10 to successfully complete: 11 12 (1) a board-approved training program that consists of not less than 120 hours and not more than 359 hours of course work as 13 14 specified by board rule; and 15 (2) a competency examination on completion of the training program. 16 17 Sec. 301.282. APPLICATION. Each person applying for a certified nurse aide certificate of registration and for inclusion 18 on the nurse aide registry must submit to the board a sworn 19 application that demonstrates the applicant's qualifications under 20 this chapter, accompanied by evidence that the applicant: 21 22 (1) has good professional character; (2) has successfully completed a training program 23 24 approved by the board; and 25 (3) has passed the examination approved by the board. 26 Sec. 301.283. ISSUANCE AND INCLUSION; FEE. (a) The board shall issue a certificate of registration as a certified nurse aide 27

No. 2718 1 to each qualified person who applies to the board on the form prescribed by the board and include the person on the nurse aide 2 3 registry. 4 (b) The board may charge a fee for the issuance of a copy of 5 a certificate of registration. 6 Sec. 301.284. TERM. (a) A certificate of registration as a 7 certified nurse aide issued under this subchapter is valid for two years. The board shall include the expiration date on each 8 certificate of registration issued under this subchapter. 9 (b) Inclusion on the nurse aide registry is valid until 10 expiration of the certificate of registration. 11 12 Sec. 301.285. RENEWAL. (a) A person may renew the person's certificate of registration as a certified nurse aide and renew 13 14 inclusion on the nurse aide registry by: 15 (1) submitting a renewal application to the board on the form prescribed by the board before the registration expires; 16 17 (2) providing proof that the person has successfully completed during the preceding two years the continuing education 18 19 hours required by Subsection (b); and 20 (3) complying with any other renewal requirements adopted by the board. 21 (b) A person who is registered as a certified nurse aide and 22 who is included on the nurse aide registry shall annually in 23 24 accordance with board rules complete at least 12 hours of continuing education. 25 26 (c) At least 30 days before the expiration of the person's certificate of registration, the board shall send written notice of 27

## the impending certificate expiration to the person at the person's <u>last known address according to the records of the board.</u>

3 SECTION 7. Section 301.407(b), Occupations Code, is amended 4 to read as follows:

5 (b) Unless expressly prohibited by state or federal law, a 6 state agency that has reason to believe that a nurse <u>or nurse aide</u> 7 has engaged in conduct subject to reporting shall report the nurse 8 <u>or nurse aide</u> in writing to the board or to a nursing peer review 9 committee under Chapter 303.

SECTION 8. Section 301.451, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

12 Sec. 301.451. CERTAIN PROHIBITED PRACTICES. A person may 13 not:

14 (1) sell, fraudulently obtain, or fraudulently 15 furnish a nursing diploma, license, <u>certificate</u>, renewal license <u>or</u> 16 <u>certificate</u>, or record;

17 (2) assist another person in selling, fraudulently
18 obtaining, or fraudulently furnishing a nursing diploma, license,
19 <u>certificate</u>, renewal license <u>or certificate</u>, or record;

20 (3) practice nursing <u>or practice as a nurse aide</u> under
21 a diploma, license, <u>certificate</u>, or record that was:

(A) obtained unlawfully or fraudulently; or
(B) signed or issued unlawfully or under false

24 representation; or

(4) practice nursing <u>or practice as a nurse aide</u> in a
 period in which the person's license <u>or certificate</u> is suspended or
 revoked.

SECTION 9. Section 301.452(b), Occupations Code, is amended
to read as follows:

3 (b) A person is subject to denial of a license or
4 certificate or to disciplinary action under this subchapter for:

5 (1) a violation of this chapter, a rule or regulation 6 not inconsistent with this chapter, or an order issued under this 7 chapter;

8 (2) fraud or deceit in procuring or attempting to 9 procure a license to practice professional nursing or vocational 10 nursing or a nurse aide certificate;

(3) a conviction for, or placement on deferred adjudication community supervision or deferred disposition for, a felony or for a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude;

14 (4) conduct that results in the revocation of 15 probation imposed because of conviction for a felony or for a 16 misdemeanor involving moral turpitude;

17 (5) use of a nursing license, diploma, or permit, <u>a</u> 18 <u>nurse aide certificate</u>, or the transcript of such a document, that 19 has been fraudulently purchased, issued, counterfeited, or 20 materially altered;

(6) impersonating or acting as a proxy for another person in the licensing examination required under Section 301.253 or 301.255;

(7) directly or indirectly aiding or abetting an unlicensed <u>or uncertified</u> person in connection with the unauthorized practice of nursing <u>or unauthorized practice as a</u> nurse aide;

1 (8) revocation, suspension, or denial of, or any other action relating to, the person's license, certificate, or privilege 2 3 to practice nursing or to practice as a nurse aide in another jurisdiction; 4

5 (9) intemperate use of alcohol or drugs that the board determines endangers or could endanger a patient; 6

7 unprofessional or dishonorable conduct that, in (10)8 the board's opinion, is likely to deceive, defraud, or injure a patient or the public; 9

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(11)adjudication of mental incompetency;

lack of fitness to practice because of a mental or 11 (12)12 physical health condition that could result in injury to a patient or the public; or 13

14 (13) failure to care adequately for a patient or to 15 conform to the minimum standards of acceptable nursing practice in a manner that, in the board's opinion, exposes a patient or other 16 person unnecessarily to risk of harm. 17

SECTION 10. Section 301.453, Occupations Code, is amended 18 19 to read as follows:

Sec. 301.453. DISCIPLINARY AUTHORITY OF BOARD; METHODS OF 20 21 DISCIPLINE. (a) If the board determines that a person has committed an act listed in Section 301.452(b), the board shall 22 23 enter an order imposing one or more of the following:

24 (1) denial of the person's application for a license or certificate, license or certificate renewal, or temporary permit; 25 26 (2)

issuance of a written warning;

27 (3) administration of a public reprimand;

No. 2718 1 (4) limitation or restriction of the person's license or certificate, including: 2 limiting to or excluding from the person's 3 (A) practice one or more specified activities of nursing or as a nurse 4 5 aide; or 6 (B) stipulating periodic board review; 7 (5) suspension of the person's license or certificate 8 for a period not to exceed five years; 9 revocation of the person's license or certificate; (6) 10 or (7) assessment of a fine. 11 In addition to or instead of an action under Subsection 12 (b) (a), the board, by order, may require the person to: 13 14 (1)submit to care, counseling, or treatment by a 15 health provider designated by the board as a condition for the issuance or renewal of a license or certificate; 16 17 (2) participate in a program of education or counseling prescribed by the board; 18 specified period 19 (3) practice for a under the direction of a registered nurse or vocational nurse designated by 20 21 the board; or (4) perform public board considers 22 service the 23 appropriate. 24 (c) The board may probate any penalty imposed on a nurse or nurse aide and may accept the voluntary surrender of a license or 25 26 certificate. The board may not reinstate a surrendered license or certificate unless it determines that the person is competent to 27

1 resume practice.

2 (d) If the board suspends, revokes, or accepts surrender of 3 a license <u>or certificate</u>, the board may impose conditions for 4 reinstatement that the person must satisfy before the board may 5 issue an unrestricted license or certificate.

6 SECTION 11. Section 301.4531(c), Occupations Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

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(c) In the case of a person described by:

9 (1) Subsection (b)(1)(A), the board shall consider 10 taking a more severe disciplinary action, including revocation of 11 the person's license <u>or certificate</u>, than the disciplinary action 12 that would be taken for a single violation; and

13 (2) Subsection (b)(1)(B), the board shall consider 14 taking a more severe disciplinary action, including revocation of 15 the person's license <u>or certificate</u>, than the disciplinary action 16 that would be taken for a person who has not previously been the 17 subject of disciplinary action by the board.

18 SECTION 12. Section 301.4535, Occupations Code, is amended 19 to read as follows:

Sec. 301.4535. REQUIRED SUSPENSION, REVOCATION, OR REFUSAL OF LICENSE <u>OR CERTIFICATE</u> FOR CERTAIN OFFENSES. (a) The board shall suspend a nurse's license <u>or a nurse aide's certificate</u> or refuse to issue a license <u>or certificate</u> to an applicant on proof that the nurse<u>, nurse aide</u>, or applicant has been initially convicted of:

1 Section 19.04, Penal Code;

2 (2) kidnapping or unlawful restraint under Chapter 20,
3 Penal Code, and the offense was punished as a felony or state jail
4 felony;

5 (3) sexual assault under Section 22.011, Penal Code;
6 (4) aggravated sexual assault under Section 22.021,
7 Penal Code;

8 (5) continuous sexual abuse of young child or children 9 under Section 21.02, Penal Code, or indecency with a child under 10 Section 21.11, Penal Code;

11 (6) aggravated assault under Section 22.02, Penal 12 Code;

13 (7) intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly injuring
14 a child, elderly individual, or disabled individual under Section
15 22.04, Penal Code;

16 (8) intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly 17 abandoning or endangering a child under Section 22.041, Penal Code; 18 (9) aiding suicide under Section 22.08, Penal Code, 19 and the offense was punished as a state jail felony;

20 (10) an offense under Section 25.07, Penal Code, 21 punished as a felony;

(11) an offense under Section 25.071, Penal Code,punished as a felony;

24 (12) an agreement to abduct a child from custody under25 Section 25.031, Penal Code;

26 (13) the sale or purchase of a child under Section27 25.08, Penal Code;

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(14) robbery under Section 29.02, Penal Code;

2 (15) aggravated robbery under Section 29.03, Penal 3 Code;

4 (16) an offense for which a defendant is required to 5 register as a sex offender under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal 6 Procedure; or

7 (17) an offense under the law of another state, 8 federal law, or the Uniform Code of Military Justice that contains 9 elements that are substantially similar to the elements of an 10 offense listed in this subsection.

(b) On final conviction or a plea of guilty or nolo 11 12 contendere for an offense listed in Subsection (a), the board, as appropriate, may not issue a license or certificate to an 13 14 applicant, shall refuse to renew a license or certificate, or shall 15 revoke a license or certificate if the applicant or license or certificate holder did not previously disclose the conviction or 16 17 plea and the fifth anniversary of the date the person successfully completed community supervision or parole has not occurred. 18

(c) A person is not eligible for an initial license <u>or</u> <u>certificate</u> or for reinstatement or endorsement of a license to practice nursing <u>or a certificate as a nurse aide</u> in this state before the fifth anniversary of the date the person successfully completed and was dismissed from community supervision or parole for an offense described by Subsection (a).

25 SECTION 13. Sections 301.454(a), (c), and (e), Occupations 26 Code, are amended to read as follows:

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(a) Except in the case of a temporary suspension authorized

Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a person is 20 (e) not entitled to a hearing on a refusal to renew a license or certificate 21 if the person: 22 fails to submit a renewal application; or 23 (1)24 (2) submits an application that: 25 (A) is incomplete; shows on its face that the person does not 26 (B) meet the renewal requirements; or 27

(C) is not accompanied by the correct fee.
 SECTION 14. The heading of Section 301.455, Occupations

8 (a) The license of a nurse <u>or the certificate of a nurse aide</u> 9 shall be temporarily suspended or restricted on a determination by 10 a majority of the board or a three-member committee of board members 11 designated by the board that, from the evidence or information 12 presented, the continued practice of the nurse <u>or nurse aide</u> would 13 constitute a continuing and imminent threat to the public welfare.

14 (b) A license <u>or certificate</u> may be temporarily suspended or 15 restricted under this section without notice or hearing on the 16 complaint if:

(1) institution of proceedings for a hearing before the State Office of Administrative Hearings is initiated simultaneously with the temporary suspension or determination to restrict; and

(2) a hearing is held as soon as possible under thischapter and Chapter 2001, Government Code.

23 SECTION 16. The heading of Section 301.457, Occupations 24 Code, is amended to read as follows:

25 Sec. 301.457. COMPLAINT AND INVESTIGATION <u>RELATED TO</u> 26 <u>NURSES</u>.

27 SECTION 17. Subchapter J, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is

1 amended by adding Section 301.4571 to read as follows: 2 Sec. 301.4571. COMPLAINT AND INVESTIGATION RELATED TO NURSE 3 AIDES. (a) The board or any person may initiate a proceeding under this subchapter by filing with the board a complaint against a nurse 4 5 aide. The complaint must be in writing and signed by the 6 complainant. 7 (b) Except as otherwise provided by this section, the board a person authorized by the board shall conduct each 8 or investigation. Each complaint against a nurse aide that requires a 9 10 determination of competency shall be reviewed by a board member, consultant, or employee with a nursing background the board 11 12 considers sufficient. (c) On the filing of a complaint, the board: 13 14 (1) may conduct a preliminary investigation into the 15 identity of the nurse aide named or described in the complaint; 16 (2) shall make a timely and appropriate preliminary 17 investigation of the complaint; and 18 (3) may issue a warning or reprimand to the nurse aide. 19 (d) After any preliminary investigation to determine the identity of the subject of the complaint, unless it would 20 jeopardize an investigation, the board shall notify the nurse aide 21 22 that a complaint has been filed and the nature of the complaint. If the investigation reveals probable cause to take further 23 24 disciplinary action, the board shall either attempt an informal disposition of the complaint or file a formal charge against the 25 26 nurse aide stating the provision of this chapter or board rule that is alleged to have been violated and a brief description of each act 27

or omission that constitutes the violation. 1 (e) 2 The board shall conduct an investigation of the 3 complaint to determine: 4 (1) whether the nurse aide's continued practice poses 5 a risk of harm to clients or other persons; and 6 (2) whether probable cause exists that a nurse aide 7 committed an act listed in Section 301.452(b) or that violates 8 other law. 9 (f) In making a determination under Subsection (e), the 10 board shall review the evidence to determine the extent to which a deficiency in care by the nurse aide was the result of deficiencies 11 12 in the nurse aide's judgment, knowledge, training, or skill rather than other factors beyond the nurse aide's control. A determination 13 that a deficiency in care is attributable to a nurse aide must be 14 based on the extent to which the nurse aide's conduct was the result 15 of a deficiency in the nurse aide's judgment, knowledge, training, 16 17 or skill. (g) If the board determines after investigating a complaint 18 19 under Subsection (e) that there is reason to believe that a nurse aide's deficiency in care was the result of a factor beyond the 20 nurse aide's control, the board shall report that determination to 21 22 the patient safety committee at the facility where the nurse aide's deficiency in care occurred or, if the facility does not have a 23 24 patient safety committee, to the chief nursing officer. (h) The board and the Department of Aging and Disability 25 26 Services shall share investigation information, including files, reports, witness lists, findings, and any other pertinent 27

1 information, related to the investigation of a nurse aide by the 2 board or department.

3 SECTION 18. Sections 301.458(a) and (c), Occupations Code, 4 are amended to read as follows:

5 (a) Unless there is an agreed disposition of the complaint 6 under Section 301.463, and if probable cause is found under Section 7 301.457(e)(2) or Section 301.4571(e)(2), the board or the board's 8 authorized representative shall initiate proceedings by filing 9 formal charges against the nurse or nurse aide.

10 (c) A copy of the formal charge shall be served on the nurse
11 or <u>nurse aide, or on</u> the nurse's <u>or nurse aide's</u> counsel of record.

SECTION 19. Section 301.459(b), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

14 (b) In any hearing under this section, a nurse <u>or nurse aide</u>
15 is entitled to appear in person or by counsel.

SECTION 20. Section 301.460(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Except for good cause shown for delay and subject to any 18 (a) 19 other privilege or restriction set forth by statute, rule, or legal precedent, the board shall, not later than the 30th day after the 20 date the board receives a written request from a license or 21 certificate holder who is the subject of a formal charge filed under 22 Section 301.458 or from the license or certificate holder's counsel 23 24 of record, provide the license or certificate holder with access 25 to:

26 (1) all known exculpatory information in the board's27 possession; and

1 (2) information in the board's possession that the 2 board intends to offer into evidence in presenting its case in chief 3 at the contested hearing on the complaint.

4 SECTION 21. Section 301.462, Occupations Code, is amended 5 to read as follows:

Sec. 301.462. VOLUNTARY SURRENDER OF 6 LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE. (a) The board may revoke a nurse's license without 7 8 formal charges, notice, or opportunity of hearing if the nurse voluntarily surrenders the nurse's license to the board and 9 10 executes a sworn statement that the nurse does not desire to be licensed. 11

12 (b) The board may revoke a nurse aide's certificate without 13 formal charges, notice, or opportunity of hearing if the nurse aide 14 voluntarily surrenders the nurse aide's certificate to the board 15 and executes a sworn statement that the nurse aide does not desire 16 to be certified.

17 SECTION 22. Section 301.464(b), Occupations Code, is 18 amended to read as follows:

19 (b) Rules adopted under this section must:

(1) provide the complainant and the license or
