| 7 | Sec. 343.0115. BARKING DOGS IN CERTAIN AREAS. (a) This |
| 8 | section applies only to the unincorporated area of a county: |
| 9 | (1) that has a population of 800,000 or more; or |
| 10 | (2) that is adjacent to a county with a population of |
| 11 | 3.3 million or more and in which a planned community is located |
| 12 | that: |
| 13 | (A) has 20,000 or more acres of land; |
| 14 | (B) was originally established under the Urban |
| 15 | Growth and New Community Development Act of 1970 (42 U.S.C. Section |
| 16 | 4501 et seq.); and |
| 17 | (C) is subject to restrictive covenants |
| 18 | containing ad valorem or annual variable budget based assessments |
| 19 | on real property. |
| 20 | (b) It is a public nuisance under Section 343.011 to allow |
| 21 | the barking of or another noise made by a dog outdoors if a |
| 22 | reasonable person would find the noise objectionable, except that |
| 23 | in a county described by Subsection (a)(2), the noise is a public |
| 24 | nuisance only if made on premises in a neighborhood. |

- 1 (c) In determining whether a noise is objectionable to a
- 2 reasonable person under this section, the following factors may be
- 3 considered:
- 4 (1) the time of day the noise is produced;
- 5 (2) the proximity of the production of the noise to
- 6 other premises; and
- 7 (3) whether the sound is recurrent, intermittent, or
- 8 <u>constant</u>.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
