AN ACT 2 relating to transfer of a student of limited English proficiency 3 out of a public school bilingual education or special language 4 program.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 29.056(g), Education Code, is amended to 7 read as follows:

8 (g) A district may transfer a student of limited English 9 proficiency out of a bilingual education or special language 10 program for the first time or a subsequent time if the student is 11 able to participate equally in a regular all-English instructional 12 program as determined by:

(1) agency-approved tests administered at the end of each school year to determine the extent to which the student has developed oral and written language proficiency and specific language skills in:

1 English, [or,] if the student is enrolled in the <u>third or fourth</u>
2 [first or second] grade[, an achievement score at or above the 40th

5 (3) <u>other indications of a student's overall progress</u>, 6 <u>including</u> [agency-approved] criterion-referenced <u>test scores</u>, 7 [tests and the results of a] subjective teacher evaluation, and 8 parental evaluation.

9 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010 10 school year.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
