## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the Texas Teach Corps Scholarship Program for students
3	who agree to teach in public schools in this state that have
4	shortages of teachers in mathematics or science.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter GG to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER GG. TEXAS TEACH CORPS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
9	Sec. 61.9831. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIP.
10	(a) In accordance with this subchapter and board rules, the board
11	shall establish and administer the Texas Teach Corps Scholarship
12	Program to award scholarships to undergraduate students who:
13	(1) are enrolled in educator preparation programs
14	provided by public or private institutions of higher education in
15	this state; and
16	(2) agree to teach for a specified period in the public
17	schools in this state that are determined by the Texas Education
18	Agency to have shortages of teachers in mathematics or science.
19	(b) The amount of a scholarship under this subchapter for an
20	academic year is equal to the lesser of:
21	(1) the total amount of tuition that the public or
22	private institution of higher education in which the scholarship
23	recipient is enrolled charges the recipient for that academic year

for semester credit hours for which the recipient may use the

1 scholarship to pay tuition as provided by Subsection (c); or 2 (2) \$5,000. 3 (c) A student may use a scholarship under this subchapter only to pay tuition for a semester credit hour that is required for 4 5 completion of the educator preparation program in which the student 6 is enrolled. 7 (d) For purposes of this subchapter, not later than April 1 8 of each school year, the Texas Education Agency shall determine which public schools in this state are anticipated to have 9 10 shortages of mathematics or science teachers during the following school year and shall provide that information to the board and to 11 12 each educator preparation program in this state accredited by the State Board for <u>Educator Certification</u>. 13 Sec. 61.9832. ELIGIBILITY; LIMITATION ON 14 NUMBER 15 SCHOLARSHIPS. (a) To be eligible to receive a scholarship under 16 this subchapter, a person must: 17 (1) have graduated from a high school in this state 18 with an overall grade point average: 19 (A) of at least 2.75 on a four-point scale or the 20 equivalent; and 21 (B) in the top 35 percent of the student's 22 graduating class; 23 (2) be enrolled in an educator preparation program 24 accredited by the State Board for Educator Certification that is

provided by a public or private institution of higher education in

this state; and

- 2 (b) Not more than 4,000 scholarships may be awarded under
- 3 this subchapter for an academic year.
- 4 (b-1) This subsection expires September 1, 2013.
- 5 Notwithstanding Subsection (b), not more than the following number
- 6 of scholarships may be awarded under this subchapter for the
- 7 specified academic year:
- 8 (1) for the 2010-2011 academic year, not more than
- 9 1,000 scholarships may be awarded;
- 10 (2) for the 2011-2012 academic year, not more than
- 11 2,000 scholarships may be awarded; and
- 12 (3) for the 2012-2013 academic year, not more than
- 13 3,000 scholarships may be awarded.
- 14 (c) If in any year the amount of money available for
- 15 scholarships under this subchapter is insufficient to award a
- 16 scholarship to each eligible applicant or if there are more
- 17 eligible applicants than the number of scholarships authorized by
- 18 this section, the board shall establish criteria to determine which
- 19 eligible applicants will be granted scholarships as the board
- 20 determines appropriate to further the purposes of this subchapter,
- 21 including criteria that:
- 22 (1) are related to the financial need of an applicant;
- 23 <u>and</u>
- 24 (2) serve to ensure geographic and ethnic diversity
- 25 among scholarship recipients.
- Sec. 61.9833. AGREEMENT REQUIREMENTS. (a) To qualify for a
- 27 scholarship under this subchapter, a person must enter into a

- 1 written agreement with the board as provided by this section. The
- 2 agreement must:
- 3 (1) specify the conditions the person must satisfy to
- 4 receive the scholarship award;
- 5 (2) require the person to earn a baccalaureate degree
- 6 through completion of an educator preparation program accredited by
- 7 the State Board for Educator Certification that is provided by a
- 8 public or private institution of higher education in this state;
- 9 (3) require the person to obtain, within the period
- 10 prescribed by board rule, appropriate certification under
- 11 Subchapter B, Chapter 21, to teach mathematics or science in a
- 12 public school in this state;
- 13 (4) require the person to accept, for the first school
- 14 year that begins after the date the person obtains the appropriate
- 15 certification, an offer of full-time employment to teach
- 16 <u>mathematics</u> or science, as applicable based on the person's
- 17 certification, in a public school in this state selected by the
- 18 person from among schools anticipated by the Texas Education Agency
- 19 to have shortages of teachers in that subject for that first school
- 20 year for which the person is accepting employment;
- 21 <u>(5) require the person to complete eight years of</u>
- 22 full-time employment teaching as follows:
- 23 (A) beginning with the school year described by
- 24 Subdivision (4), four consecutive school years of employment
- 25 <u>teaching mathematics or science</u>, as applicable based on the
- 26 person's certification, in one or more public schools in this state
- 27 selected by the person from among schools anticipated by the Texas

- 1 Education Agency to have shortages of teachers in that subject for
- 2 the person's applicable year of employment by the school; and
- 3 (B) beginning with the school year immediately
- 4 following the last of the four consecutive school years described
- 5 by Paragraph (A), four additional consecutive school years teaching
- 6 in any public school in this state;
- 7 (6) provide that any scholarship award the person
- 8 receives under this subchapter constitutes an interest-free loan
- 9 until the person:
- (A) subject to Section 61.9835, satisfies the
- 11 requirements of Subdivision (5) and any other applicable conditions
- 12 of the agreement; or
- 13 (B) is excused from the repayment obligation in
- 14 accordance with law; and
- 15 (7) require the person to sign a promissory note
- 16 acknowledging the conditional nature of the scholarship award
- 17 received and promising to repay any unforgiven amount of that award
- 18 and reasonable collection costs if the person does not satisfy the
- 19 applicable conditions and is not excused from the repayment
- 20 obligation in accordance with law.
- 21 (b) To satisfy the teaching obligation prescribed by an
- 22 agreement under this section, a person must teach mathematics or
- 23 science courses for not less than an average of four hours each
- 24 school day.
- (c) For purposes of Subsection (a)(5)(A), if a person is
- 26 employed as a teacher in a public school anticipated to have a
- 27 shortage of teachers in mathematics or science in the first year of

- 1 employment, each subsequent year of continuous employment as a
- 2 teacher in that school is considered to be employment in a school
- 3 anticipated to have such a shortage of teachers in that subject in
- 4 that subsequent year, regardless of whether the Texas Education
- 5 Agency anticipated that the school would have a shortage of
- 6 teachers in that subject in that year.
- 7 (d) The board shall determine the terms of the promissory
- 8 note required by Subsection (a)(7). To the extent practicable, the
- 9 terms must be the same as those applicable to state or federally
- 10 guaranteed student loans made at the same time.
- 11 Sec. 61.9834. EXCEPTIONS TO TEACHING AND REPAYMENT
- 12 OBLIGATIONS. (a) A person is not considered to be in violation of
- 13 the teaching obligation in the agreement described by Section
- 14 61.9833 during any period in which the person:
- 15 (1) is pursuing a full-time course of study related to
- 16 the field of teaching offered by a public or private institution of
- 17 higher education in this state and approved by the State Board for
- 18 Educator Certification;
- 19 (2) is serving on active duty as a member of the armed
- 20 forces of the United States, including as a member of a reserve
- 21 <u>force or National Guard called to active duty;</u>
- 22 (3) is temporarily totally disabled for a period not
- 23 to exceed 36 months as established by the affidavit of a qualified
- 24 physician;
- 25 (4) is unable to secure employment for a period not to
- 26 exceed 12 months because of care required by a disabled spouse or
- 27 child;

- 1 (5) is seeking and unable to find, for a single period
- 2 not to exceed 12 months, full-time employment teaching in a public
- 3 school in this state, or if the person is within the period of the
- 4 agreement described by Section 61.9833(a)(5)(A), full-time
- 5 employment teaching in a public school in this state anticipated to
- 6 have a shortage of mathematics or science teachers, as applicable
- 7 based on the person's certification, for the year for which the
- 8 person is seeking employment; or
- 9 (6) satisfies the provisions of any other teaching
- 10 <u>exception adopted by the board.</u>
- 11 (b) A person is excused from the repayment obligation in a
- 12 promissory note described by Section 61.9833 if:
- 13 (1) the person becomes permanently totally disabled as
- 14 established by the affidavit of a qualified physician; or
- 15 (2) the board waives repayment in the case of extreme
- 16 <u>hardship to the person.</u>
- 17 Sec. 61.9835. FORGIVENESS OF REPAYMENT OBLIGATION. The
- 18 board shall forgive 25 percent of the total amount of a person's
- 19 scholarship awards under this subchapter for each complete school
- 20 year the person teaches in accordance with the agreement under
- 21 Section 61.9833 after the expiration of the period described by
- 22 <u>Subsection (a)(5)(A) of that section.</u>
- 23 Sec. 61.9836. GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS. In addition to
- 24 money appropriated by the legislature, the board may solicit and
- 25 accept grants, gifts, and donations from any public or private
- 26 source for the purposes of this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9837. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules to

- 1 administer this subchapter, including rules:
- 2 (1) providing for the manner in which a student may
- 3 apply for a scholarship; and
- 4 (2) providing for notification of the scholarship
- 5 program under this subchapter to students enrolled in educator
- 6 preparation programs in this state.
- 7 (b) The board shall distribute to each educator preparation
- 8 program of a public or private institution of higher education in
- 9 this state a copy of the rules adopted under this section.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 31, 2009, the Texas
- 11 Higher Education Coordinating Board and the Texas Education Agency
- 12 shall adopt rules for the Texas Teach Corps Scholarship Program
- 13 under Subchapter GG, Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this
- 14 Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
