A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| AN ACT |
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- 2 relating to the revision of building energy efficiency performance
- 3 standards.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 388, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Section 388.0035 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 388.0035. REVISION OF STANDARDS. (a) At least once
- 8 every five years, the State Energy Conservation Office shall
- 9 review:
- 10 (1) revisions made by the International Code Council
- 11 to the International Energy Conservation Code and the energy
- 12 efficiency chapter of the International Residential Code after May
- 13 1, 2001; and
- 14 (2) local amendments made to the codes or energy
- 15 <u>efficiency</u> programs that have strengthened energy efficiency
- 16 requirements.
- 17 (b) The review must be conducted in consultation with the
- 18 <u>laboratory</u> and an advisory committee established by the State
- 19 Energy Conservation Office.
- 20 <u>(c) The State Energy Conservation Office by rule shall</u>
- 21 establish a procedure for persons who have an interest in the
- 22 adoption of standards for energy efficiency under Sections
- 23 388.003(a) and (b) to have an opportunity to comment on the
- 24 standards under consideration. The office shall consider persons

- 1 who have an interest in adoption of standards to include:
- 2 (1) commercial and residential builders, architects,
- 3 and engineers;
- 4 (2) municipal, county, and other local governmental
- 5 authorities; and
- 6 (3) environmental groups.
- 7 (d) Following the completion of the review, the State Energy
- 8 Conservation Office by rule shall adopt revised standards for
- 9 energy efficiency to replace the standards under Sections
- 10 388.003(a) and (b).
- 11 (e) The revised standards must result in reducing either
- 12 projected annual or ozone season energy consumption in new
- 13 buildings by a minimum of 15 percent compared to the standards being
- 14 used at the time of the review.
- (f) To achieve the goal of adopting standards by January 1,
- 16 2030, that will result in residential construction designed to
- 17 consume no more energy on a net annual basis than can be produced
- 18 <u>on-site</u> from renewable energy sources, the State Energy
- 19 Conservation Office and the advisory committee shall, not later
- 20 than January 1, 2011:
- 21 (1) conduct a study on the feasibility of reaching
- 22 that goal; and
- 23 (2) make recommendations to the legislature on a
- 24 schedule for adopting progressive standards to reach that goal.
- 25 SECTION 2. The following sections are repealed:
- 26 (1) Sections 388.003(b-1) and (b-2), Health and Safety
- 27 Code, as added by Section 3.01, Chapter 262 (S.B. 12), and Section

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- 1 11, Chapter 939 (H.B. 3693), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular
- 2 Session, 2007; and
- 3 (2) Section 388.003(b-3), Health and Safety Code.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
