- 2 relating to the water pressure standards for fire hydrants in
- 3 certain municipalities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 341.0357(b), (c), (d), (e), and (f),
- 6 Health and Safety Code, as added by Chapter 861 (H.B. 1391), Acts of
- 7 the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, are amended to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (b) The regulatory authority for a public utility shall by
- 10 rule or ordinance adopt standards for maintaining sufficient water
- 11 pressure for service to fire hydrants adequate to protect public
- 12 safety in residential areas in a municipality with a population of
- 13 10,000 [1,000,000] or more.
- 14 (c) The commission shall assess residential areas in a
- 15 municipality with a population of 10,000 [1,000,000] or more to
- 16 ensure that:
- 17 (1) the regulatory authority for the area has adopted
- 18 the standards required by this section; and
- 19 (2) all public utilities serving the residential area
- 20 are complying with the standards required by this section.
- 21 (d) The commission shall require a municipality with a
- 22 population of $10,000 [\frac{1,000,000}{}]$ or more and acting as a regulatory
- 23 authority to make appropriate revisions to standards the commission
- 24 considers to be inadequate within a reasonable time established by

- 1 the commission.
- 2 (e) The commission shall require a public utility in
- 3 violation of a standard required under this section and established
- 4 by the commission or by a municipality with a population of 10,000
- [1,000,000] or more and acting as a regulatory authority to comply
- 6 with the standard within a reasonable time established by the
- 7 commission.
- 8 (f) This section does not limit the authority of a
- 9 municipality with a population of 10,000 [1,000,000] or more and
- 10 acting as a regulatory authority to prohibit a public utility in
- 11 violation of a standard established by the municipality from
- 12 recovering through the public utility's rates a penalty or fine
- 13 incurred for a violation of a standard.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
