4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 24, Property Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 24.0071 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 24.0071. APPOINTMENT OF COUNSEL IN CERTAIN APPEALS.
8	(a) On a written application of any party to an eviction suit, the
9	county court or county court at law in which an appeal of the suit is
10	filed shall appoint counsel to attend to the cause of a party who:
11	(1) was in possession of the residence at the time the
12	eviction suit was filed in the justice court; and

- (2) has perfected the appeal on a pauper's affidavit 13
- approved in accordance with Rule 749a, Texas Rules of Civil 14
- 15 Procedure.
- (b) The appointed counsel shall represent the individual in 16
- the proceedings of the suit in the county court or county court at 17
- law. At the conclusion of those proceedings, the appointment 18
- 19 terminates.
- 20 (c) The court may terminate representation appointed under
- 21 this section for cause.
- 22 (d) Reasonable attorney's fees and expenses of appointed
- counsel shall be: 23
- 24 (1) taxed by the court in any manner the court

- 1 considers fair and just; and
- 2 (2) paid by the county in which the suit is filed, in
- 3 <u>appropriate suits.</u>
- 4 (e) The court shall provide for a method of service of
- 5 written notice on the parties to an eviction suit of the right to an
- 6 appointment of counsel on perfection of appeal on approval of a
- 7 pauper's affidavit.
- 8 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to an eviction suit filed on or after the effective date of this
- 10 Act. A suit filed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 11 by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that law is
- 12 continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
