- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 81, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 81.117 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 81.117. DISCLOSURE OF LACK OF PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY
- 8 INSURANCE. (a) The supreme court shall promulgate rules that
- 9 require an attorney engaged in the practice of law in this state who
- 10 is not covered by professional liability insurance covering claims
- 11 arising from providing or failing to provide legal services to:
- 12 (1) display in a prominent location in the attorney's
- 13 place of business a notice stating that the attorney is not covered
- 14 by professional liability insurance; or
- 15 (2) provide notice of that information in another
- 16 manner to the attorney's clients and prospective clients.
- 17 (b) In promulgating rules under this section, the supreme
- 18 court shall:

- 20 described by Subsection (a); and
- 21 (2) provide for enforcement of the rules promulgated
- 22 under this section, including providing that a person may file a
- 23 grievance, and the state bar may take disciplinary action for a
- 24 violation, in the same manner that a grievance is filed and the

- 1 state bar takes disciplinary action for conduct that constitutes
- 2 professional misconduct under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of
- 3 Professional Conduct.
- 4 SECTION 2. The Texas Supreme Court shall adopt rules as
- 5 required by Section 81.117, Government Code, as added by this Act,
- 6 not later than December 1, 2009.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
