A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the establishment and funding of emergency medical
- 3 power stations.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 418.042(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The division shall prepare and keep current a
- 8 comprehensive state emergency management plan. The plan may
- 9 include:
- 10 (1) provisions for prevention and minimization of
- 11 injury and damage caused by disaster;
- 12 (2) provisions for prompt and effective response to
- 13 disaster;
- 14 (3) provisions for emergency relief;
- 15 (4) provisions for energy emergencies;
- 16 (5) identification of areas particularly vulnerable
- 17 to disasters;
- 18 (6) recommendations for zoning, building
- 19 restrictions, and other land-use controls, safety measures for
- 20 securing mobile homes or other nonpermanent or semipermanent
- 21 structures, and other preventive and preparedness measures
- 22 designed to eliminate or reduce disasters or their impact;
- 23 (7) provisions for assistance to local officials in
- 24 designing local emergency management plans;

- 1 (8) authorization and procedures for the erection or
- 2 other construction of temporary works designed to protect against
- 3 or mitigate danger, damage, or loss from flood, fire, or other
- 4 disaster;
- 5 (9) preparation and distribution to the appropriate
- 6 state and local officials of state catalogs of federal, state, and
- 7 private assistance programs;
- 8 (10) organization of manpower and channels of
- 9 assistance;
- 10 (11) coordination of federal, state, and local
- 11 emergency management activities;
- 12 (12) coordination of the state emergency management
- 13 plan with the emergency management plans of the federal government;
- 14 (13) coordination of federal and state energy
- 15 emergency plans;
- 16 (14) provisions for education and training of local
- 17 officials on activation of the Emergency Alert System established
- 18 under 47 C.F.R. Part 11; [and]
- 19 (15) provisions for establishing, in cooperation with
- 20 <u>local hospitals</u>, emergency medical power stations where residents
- 21 affected by a power outage following a disaster can power medical
- 22 devices, including life support equipment, without visiting a
- 23 hospital; and
- 24 (16) other necessary matters relating to disasters.
- SECTION 2. Section 418.073, Government Code, is amended by
- 26 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 27 (e) A state agency, political subdivision, or hospital may

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- 1 request funding from the disaster contingency fund to pay for the
- 2 costs of establishing and operating an emergency medical power
- 3 station where residents affected by a power outage following a
- 4 disaster can power medical devices, including life support
- 5 equipment, without visiting a hospital. To the extent funds are
- 6 available, the division shall approve all reasonable requests for
- 7 funding under this subsection.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
