A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to adoption and ownership of mathematics and science
- 3 textbooks for public school students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 31.022, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 7 <u>(f) This section does not apply to a textbook whose contents</u>
- 8 are submitted under Section 31.036.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 31.0221, Education Code, is amended by
- 10 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 11 (c) This section does not apply to a textbook whose contents
- 12 <u>are submitted under Section 31.036.</u>
- 13 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 31.0251 to read as follows:
- Sec. 31.0251. LIMITATIONS ON ROYALTIES. The State Board of
- 16 Education shall set limits on royalties that may be paid from the
- 17 state textbook fund for a textbook whose contents are submitted
- 18 under Section 31.036. Royalty limits may depend on subject, grade
- 19 <u>level</u>, and number of copies printed and distributed to students who
- 20 <u>reside in this state.</u>
- SECTION 4. Section 31.026, Education Code, is amended by
- 22 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 23 <u>(d) For each textbook whose contents are submitted under</u>
- 24 Section 31.036, the State Board of Education shall execute a

- 1 contract that would forever permit this state to print and
- 2 distribute as many copies as are needed for students who reside in
- 3 this state.
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 31.027, Education Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 6 (c) This section does not apply to a textbook whose contents
- 7 are submitted under Section 31.036.
- 8 SECTION 6. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 31.0271 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 31.0271. INFORMATION ON LOW COST MATHEMATICS AND
- 11 SCIENCE TEXTBOOKS. (a) For a textbook whose contents are submitted
- 12 under Section 31.036, the public shall be allowed to view, free of
- 13 charge:
- 14 (1) the table of contents and contact information of
- 15 content providers on the Texas Education Agency's website; and
- 16 (2) the entire contents at regional education service
- 17 centers and at other locations as provided for by the State Board of
- 18 Education.
- 19 (b) On request of a school district, the State Board of
- 20 Education shall provide a copy of the contents of a textbook adopted
- 21 <u>under Section 31.037(b).</u>
- SECTION 7. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 31.036 to read as follows:
- Sec. 31.036. SUBMISSION OF CONTENTS FOR LOW COST
- 25 MATHEMATICS AND SCIENCE TEXTBOOKS. Submission of contents for a
- 26 low cost mathematics or science textbook shall consist of:
- 27 (1) delivery of the contents to the commissioner in a

- 1 form that meets physical and format standards set by the State Board
- 2 of Education;
- 3 (2) optional delivery to the commissioner of
- 4 translations of the contents into other languages or other formats
- 5 [for example, Spanish, Braille];
- 6 (3) execution by the copyright owners of a contract
- 7 that would:
- 8 (A) permit this state to arrange for translation
- 9 of the contents into languages and formats not delivered; and
- 10 (B) permit this state to forever print and
- 11 distribute as many copies of the contents as are needed for students
- 12 who reside in this state; and
- 13 (4) payment of a submission fee.
- SECTION 8. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 15 amended by adding Section 31.037 to read as follows:
- Sec. 31.037. REVIEW AND ADOPTION OF LOW COST TEXTBOOKS BY
- 17 STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION. (a) The State Board of Education shall
- 18 adopt rules for the review and adoption of textbooks whose contents
- 19 are submitted under Section 31.036. The board may select textbooks
- 20 for review according to rules that involve requests by school
- 21 <u>districts</u> and open-enrollment charter schools submitted under
- 22 Section 31.1001.
- 23 (b) For a textbook reviewed by the board under Subsection
- 24 (a), by majority vote, the board shall:
- 25 (1) place the textbook on a conforming or
- 26 nonconforming list; or
- 27 (2) reject the textbook for placement on a conforming

- 1 <u>or nonconforming list.</u>
- 2 (c) A textbook placed on a conforming or nonconforming list
- 3 under subsection (b) shall remain on the list until removed from the
- 4 list by majority vote of the board.
- 5 (d) Within one month of placement of a textbook on, or
- 6 removal of a textbook from, a conforming or nonconforming list, the
- 7 board shall provide an updated list of adopted textbooks to each
- 8 school district. Each nonconforming list must include the reasons
- 9 an adopted textbook is not eligible for the conforming list.
- 10 SECTION 9. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 31.038 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 31.038. COMPETITIVE BID TO PRINT, BIND, AND DELIVER
- 13 LOW COST TEXTBOOKS. (a) The State Board of Education shall adopt
- 14 rules under which textbooks adopted under Section 31.037(b)(1) are
- 15 printed, bound, and delivered to depositories in this state at
- 16 costs determined by competitive bid within cost limits set by the
- 17 board.
- 18 (b) A textbook printed and bound under Subsection (a) is not
- 19 required to meet generally applicable physical requirements
- 20 adopted under Section 31.023(a) but must meet any physical
- 21 requirements adopted by the board.
- 22 <u>(c) Bidders must agree to meet physical standards and</u>
- 23 <u>delivery dates set by the board.</u>
- 24 (d) The board may provide for the disregard of a bid by a
- 25 bidder who:
- 26 (1) fails to show sufficient evidence of ability to
- 27 deliver on the bid; or

- 1 (2) failed to deliver on a previously accepted bid.
- 2 SECTION 10. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 31.039 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 31.039. ERRATA LISTS TO CORRECT FACTUAL ERRORS. (a)
- 5 For a textbook on a conforming or nonconforming list, an errata list
- 6 shall be made available on the Texas Education Agency's website and
- 7 updated periodically as factual errors are found.
- 8 (b) A textbook shall not be excluded from a conforming or
- 9 nonconforming list due to a factual error that is corrected on an
- 10 errata list to be inserted into each copy of the textbook to be
- 11 distributed by school districts and open-enrollment charter
- 12 schools.
- 13 SECTION 11. Subchapter C, Chapter 31, Education Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 31.1001 to read as follows:
- Sec. 31.1001. REQUEST FOR THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO
- 16 REVIEW A LOW COST MATHEMATICS OR SCIENCE TEXTBOOK. (a) For a
- 17 textbook whose contents are submitted under Section 31.036, a
- 18 school district or open-enrollment charter school may request for
- 19 the State Board of Education to review the book for possible
- 20 placement on a conforming or nonconforming list. The request
- 21 <u>shall:</u>
- 22 (1) state the subject and grade level for which the
- 23 book is intended to be used;
- 24 (2) state the number of students in the district or
- 25 school who attend classes that use the book;
- 26 (3) state the estimated number of copies that the
- 27 district or school would requisition per year if the book were to be

- 1 placed on a conforming or nonconforming list;
- 2 (4) describe the extent of the district's or school's
- 3 review of the book and list those district or school employees
- 4 responsible for the review;
- 5 (5) list any factual errors that may have been found.
- 6 (b) A request shall remain valid until retracted by the
- 7 district or school or until the district or school submits a
- 8 subsequent request for the State Board of Education to review
- 9 another textbook for the same subject and grade level.
- 10 SECTION 12. Section 31.102(a), Education Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (a) Each textbook purchased as provided by this chapter is
- 13 the property of this state <u>, except that a textbook adopted under</u>
- 14 Section 31.037(b) may become the property of the student as
- 15 provided by Section 31.104(f).
- SECTION 13. Section 31.104, Education Code, is amended by
- 17 amending Subsections (c) and (d) and adding Subsection (f) to read
- 18 as follows:
- 19 (c) Each textbook must state that the textbook is the
- 20 property of or is licensed to this state, as appropriate. Each
- 21 textbook, other than a textbook whose contents are submitted under
- 22 <u>Section 31.036 or</u> an electronic textbook, must be covered by the
- 23 student under the direction of the teacher. Except as provided by
- 24 Subsection (f), a [A] student must return all textbooks to the
- 25 teacher at the end of the school year or when the student withdraws
- 26 from school.
- 27 (d) Each student, or the student's parent or guardian, is

- 1 responsible for each textbook not returned by the student. Except as provided by Subsection (f), a [A] student who fails to return all 2 3 textbooks forfeits the right to free textbooks until each textbook previously issued but not returned is paid for by the student, 4 parent, or guardian. As provided by policy of the board of trustees 5 or governing body, a school district or open-enrollment charter 6 school may waive or reduce the payment requirement if the student is 7 from a low-income family. The district or school shall allow the student to use textbooks at school during each school day. Except 9 as provided by Subsection (f), if [If] a textbook is not returned or 10 paid for, the district or school may withhold the student's 11 12 records. A district or school may not, under this subsection, prevent a student from graduating, participating in a graduation 13 ceremony, or receiving a diploma. 14
- (f) At the end of the school year for which a textbook

 adopted under Section 31.037(b) is distributed, the textbook

 becomes the property of the student to whom it is distributed. A

 school district or open-enrollment charter school may not charge a

 fee under this subsection.
- 20 SECTION 14. Section 31.105, Education Code, is amended to 21 read as follows:
- Sec. 31.105. SALE OF TEXTBOOKS. The board of trustees of a school district or governing body of an open-enrollment charter school may sell textbooks, other than textbooks whose contents are submitted under Section 31.036 and electronic textbooks, to a student or another school at the state contract price. The district shall send money from the sale of textbooks to the commissioner as

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- 1 required by the commissioner. The commissioner shall deposit the
- 2 money in the state textbook fund.
- 3 SECTION 15. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
