A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to authorizing an increase in the student union fee at the
- 3 University of Houston.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 54.526, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) The board of regents of the University of Houston System
- 9 may levy a student union fee, not to exceed \$150 [\$35] per student
- 10 for each regular semester and not to exceed \$75 [\$17.50] per student
- 11 for each term of the summer session. The sole purpose of the fee is
- 12 financing, constructing, operating, maintaining, and improving a
- 13 Student Union Building for the University of Houston. The fees
- 14 herein authorized to be levied are in addition to any use or service
- 15 fee now or hereafter authorized to be levied.
- 16 <u>(c)</u> The fee may not be charged after the fifth academic year
- 17 in which the fee is first charged unless, before the end of that
- 18 <u>academic year</u>, the university has issued bonds payable in whole or
- 19 <u>in part from the fee</u>, in which event the fee may not be charged after
- 20 the academic year in which all such bonds, including refunding
- 21 bonds for those bonds, have been fully paid.
- 22 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 23 beginning with student fees charged by a public institution of
- 24 higher education for the 2009-2010 academic year. Student fees

- 1 charged by a public institution of higher education for an academic
- 2 year before that academic year are covered by the law in effect
- 3 before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is
- 4 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
