5	SECTION 1. Section 81.050(b), Health and Safety Code, is

- 7 (b) A person whose occupation or whose volunteer service is 8 included in one or more of the following categories may request the 9 department or a health authority to order testing of another person 10 who may have exposed the person to a reportable disease, including 11 HIV infection:
- 12 (1) a law enforcement officer;
- 13 (2) a fire fighter;

- 14 (3) an emergency medical service employee or 15 paramedic;
- 16 (4) a correctional officer; [er]
- (5) an employee, contractor, or volunteer, other than a correctional officer, who performs a service in a correctional facility as defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code, or a secure correctional facility or secure detention facility as defined by Section 51.02, Family Code; or
- 22 (6) an employee of a juvenile probation department.
- 23 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 24 to an exposure to a disease that occurs on or after the effective

- 1 date of this Act. An exposure to a disease that occurs before the
- 2 effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the
- 3 exposure occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 4 that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
