4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 202, Property Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 202.018 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 202.018. REGULATION OF DISPLAY OF CERTAIN RELIGIOUS
8	ITEMS. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section, a
9	property owners' association may not enforce or adopt a restrictive
10	covenant that prohibits a property owner or resident from
11	displaying or affixing on the entry to the owner's or resident's
12	dwelling one or more religious items that reflect a tenet of the
13	owner's or resident's religion.
14	(b) This section does not prohibit the enforcement or
15	adoption of a covenant that, to the extent allowed by the
16	constitution of this state and the United States, prohibits the
17	display or affixing of a religious item on the entry to the owner's
18	<pre>dwelling that:</pre>
19	(1) threatens the public health or safety;
20	(2) violates a law;
21	(3) contains language, graphics, or any display that
22	would be offensive to the ordinary person;
23	(4) is in a location other than the entry door or

doorframe or extends past the outer edge of the doorframe of the

- 1 owner's or resident's dwelling; or
- 2 (5) individually or in combination with each other
- 3 religious item displayed or affixed on the entry door or doorframe
- 4 has a total size of greater than 25 square inches.
- 5 (c) Except as otherwise provided by this section, this
- 6 section does not authorize an owner or resident to use a material or
- 7 color for an entry door or doorframe of the owner's or resident's
- 8 dwelling or make an alteration to the entry door or doorframe that
- 9 is not authorized by the restrictive covenants governing the
- 10 <u>dwelling</u>.
- 11 (d) A property owners' association may remove an item
- 12 displayed in violation of a restrictive covenant permitted by this
- 13 section.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
