A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the minimum salary schedule for certain public school

- 3 employees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 12.133(b), (c), (d), and (e), Education
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) Each school year, using state funds received by the
- 8 charter holder for that purpose under Subsection (d), a charter
- 9 holder that participated in the program under Chapter 1579,
- 10 Insurance Code, for the 2005-2006 school year shall provide
- 11 employees of the charter holder, other than administrators,
- 12 compensation in the form of annual salaries, incentives, or other
- 13 compensation determined appropriate by the charter holder that
- 14 results in an average compensation increase for classroom teachers,
- 15 full-time librarians, full-time counselors, full-time speech
- 16 <u>language pathologists</u>, full-time audiologists, and full-time
- 17 school nurses who are employed by the charter holder and who would
- 18 be entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402 if employed by
- 19 a school district, in an amount at least equal to \$2,500.
- 20 (c) Each school year, using state funds received by the
- 21 charter holder for that purpose under Subsection (e), a charter
- 22 holder that did not participate in the program under Chapter 1579,
- 23 Insurance Code, for the 2005-2006 school year shall provide
- 24 employees of the charter holder, other than administrators,

- 1 compensation in the form of annual salaries, incentives, or other
- 2 compensation determined appropriate by the charter holder that
- 3 results in an average compensation increase for classroom teachers,
- 4 full-time librarians, full-time counselors, full-time speech
- 5 language pathologists, full-time audiologists, and full-time
- 6 school nurses who are employed by the charter holder and who would
- 7 be entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402 if employed by
- 8 a school district, in an amount at least equal to \$2,000.
- 9 (d) Each school year, in addition to any amounts to which a
- 10 charter holder is entitled under this chapter, a charter holder
- 11 that participated in the program under Chapter 1579, Insurance
- 12 Code, for the 2005-2006 school year is entitled to state aid in an
- 13 amount, as determined by the commissioner, equal to the product of
- 14 \$2,500 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, full-time
- 15 librarians, full-time counselors, full-time speech language
- 16 pathologists, full-time audiologists, and full-time school nurses
- 17 employed by the charter holder at an open-enrollment charter
- 18 school.
- 19 (e) Each school year, in addition to any amounts to which a
- 20 charter holder is entitled under this chapter, a charter holder
- 21 that did not participate in the program under Chapter 1579,
- 22 Insurance Code, for the 2005-2006 school year is entitled to state
- 23 aid in an amount, as determined by the commissioner, equal to the
- 24 product of \$2,000 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers,
- 25 full-time librarians, full-time counselors, <u>full-time speech</u>
- 26 <u>language pathologists</u>, <u>full-time audiologists</u>, and <u>full-time</u>
- 27 school nurses employed by the charter holder at an open-enrollment

- 1 charter school.
- 2 SECTION 2. Section 19.007(f), Education Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 (f) In addition to other amounts received by the district
- 5 under this section, the district is entitled to state aid in an
- 6 amount equal to the product of \$2,000 multiplied by the number of
- 7 classroom teachers, full-time librarians, full-time counselors
- 8 certified under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, full-time speech language
- 9 pathologists, full-time audiologists, and full-time school nurses
- 10 who are employed by the district and who would be entitled to a
- 11 minimum salary under Section 21.402 if employed by a school
- 12 district operating under Chapter 11.
- SECTION 3. Section 19.009(d-1), Education Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (d-1) Each school year, the district shall pay an amount at
- 16 least equal to \$2,000 to each classroom teacher, full-time
- 17 librarian, full-time counselor certified under Subchapter B,
- 18 Chapter 21, <u>full-time</u> speech language pathologist, full-time
- 19 audiologist, and full-time school nurse who is employed by the
- 20 district and who would be entitled to a minimum salary under Section
- 21 21.402 if employed by a school district operating under Chapter 11.
- 22 A payment under this section is in addition to wages the district
- 23 would otherwise pay the employee during the school year.
- SECTION 4. Sections 21.402(a) and (g), Education Code, are
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d), (e), or (f), a
- 27 school district must pay each classroom teacher, full-time

- 1 librarian, full-time counselor certified under Subchapter B,
- 2 full-time speech language pathologist, full-time audiologist, or
- 3 full-time school nurse not less than the minimum monthly salary,
- 4 based on the employee's level of experience in addition to other
- 5 factors, as determined by commissioner rule, determined by the
- 6 following formula:
- 7 $MS = SF \times FS$
- 8 where:
- 9 "MS" is the minimum monthly salary;
- "SF" is the applicable salary factor specified by Subsection
- 11 (c); and
- "FS" is the amount, as determined by the commissioner under
- 13 Subsection (b), of state and local funds per weighted student,
- 14 including funds provided under Section 42.2516(b)(1)(B), but not
- 15 funds provided under Section 42.2516(b)(1)(A), (b)(1)(C), (b)(2),
- 16 or (b)(3), available to a district eligible to receive state
- 17 assistance under Section 42.302 with a maintenance and operations
- 18 tax rate per \$100 of taxable value equal to the product of the state
- 19 compression percentage, as determined under Section 42.2516,
- 20 multiplied by \$1.50, except that the amount of state and local funds
- 21 per weighted student does not include the amount attributable to
- 22 the increase in the guaranteed level made by Chapter 1187 (H.B.
- 23 3343), Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001.
- 24 (g) The commissioner may adopt rules to govern the
- 25 application of this section, including rules that:
- 26 (1) require the payment of a minimum salary under this
- 27 section to a person employed in more than one capacity for which a

- 1 minimum salary is provided and whose combined employment in those
- 2 capacities constitutes full-time employment; and
- 3 (2) specify the credentials a person must hold to be
- 4 considered a school nurse, speech language pathologist, or
- 5 <u>audiologist</u> under this section.
- 6 SECTION 5. Sections 21.403(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A teacher, librarian, counselor, speech language
- 9 pathologist, audiologist, or nurse shall advance one step on the
- 10 minimum salary schedule under Section 21.402 for each year of
- 11 experience as a teacher, librarian, counselor, speech language
- 12 pathologist, audiologist, or nurse until step 20 is reached.
- 13 (c) The commissioner shall adopt rules for determining the
- 14 experience for which a teacher, librarian, counselor, speech
- 15 <u>language pathologist</u>, audiologist, or nurse is to be given credit
- 16 in placing the teacher, librarian, counselor, speech language
- 17 pathologist, audiologist, or nurse on the minimum salary schedule.
- 18 A district shall credit the teacher, librarian, counselor, speech
- 19 language pathologist, audiologist, or nurse for each year of
- 20 experience without regard to whether the years are consecutive.
- 21 SECTION 6. Section 30.102(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- 23 (b) A classroom teacher, full-time librarian, full-time
- 24 counselor certified under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, full-time
- 25 speech language pathologist, full-time audiologist, or full-time
- 26 school nurse employed by the commission is entitled to receive as a
- 27 minimum salary the monthly salary specified by Section 21.402. A

- 1 classroom teacher, full-time librarian, full-time counselor,
- 2 full-time speech language pathologist, full-time audiologist, or
- 3 full-time school nurse may be paid, from funds appropriated to the
- 4 commission, a salary in excess of the minimum specified by that
- 5 section, but the salary may not exceed the rate of pay for a similar
- 6 position in the public schools of an adjacent school district.
- 7 SECTION 7. Section 42.2512(a), Education Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (a) A school district, including a school district that is
- 10 otherwise ineligible for state aid under this chapter, is entitled
- 11 to state aid in an amount, as determined by the commissioner, equal
- 12 to the difference, if any, between:
- 13 (1) an amount equal to the product of \$3,000
- 14 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, full-time
- 15 librarians, full-time counselors certified under Subchapter B,
- 16 Chapter 21, <u>full-time speech language pathologists</u>, <u>full-time</u>
- 17 audiologists, and full-time school nurses employed by the district
- 18 and entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402; and
- 19 (2) an amount equal to 80 percent of the amount of
- 20 additional funds to which the district is entitled due to the
- 21 increases made by Chapter 396 (S.B. 4) [S.B. No. 4], Acts of the
- 22 76th Legislature, Regular Session, 1999, to:
- 23 (A) the equalized wealth level under Section
- 24 41.002;
- 25 (B) the basic allotment under Section 42.101; and
- (C) the guaranteed level of state and local funds
- 27 per weighted student per cent of tax effort under Section 42.302.

- 1 SECTION 8. Section 42.2516(b), Education Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (b) Subject to Subsections (b-1), (b-2), (f-1), (g), and
- 4 (h), but notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a
- 5 school district is entitled to state revenue necessary to provide
- 6 the district with the sum of:
- 7 (1) the amount of state revenue necessary to maintain
- 8 state and local revenue per student in weighted average daily
- 9 attendance in the amount equal to the greater of:
- 10 (A) the amount of state and local revenue per
- 11 student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance
- 12 and operations of the district available to the district for the
- 13 2005-2006 school year;
- 14 (B) the amount of state and local revenue per
- 15 student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance
- 16 and operations of the district to which the district would have been
- 17 entitled for the 2006-2007 school year under this chapter, as it
- 18 existed on January 1, 2006, or, if the district would have been
- 19 subject to Chapter 41, as that chapter existed on January 1, 2006,
- 20 the amount to which the district would have been entitled under that
- 21 chapter, based on the funding elements in effect for the 2005-2006
- 22 school year, if the district imposed a maintenance and operations
- 23 tax at the rate adopted by the district for the 2005 tax year; or
- (C) the amount of state and local revenue per
- 25 student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance
- 26 and operations of the district to which the district would have been
- 27 entitled for the 2006-2007 school year under this chapter, as it

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- 1 existed on January 1, 2006, or, if the district would have been
- 2 subject to Chapter 41, as that chapter existed on January 1, 2006,
- 3 the amount to which the district would have been entitled under that
- 4 chapter, based on the funding elements in effect for the 2005-2006
- 5 school year, if the district imposed a maintenance and operations
- 6 tax at the rate equal to the rate described by Section 26.08(i) or
- 7 (k)(1), Tax Code, as applicable, for the 2006 tax year;
- 8 (2) an amount equal to the product of \$2,500
- 9 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, full-time
- 10 librarians, full-time counselors certified under Subchapter B,
- 11 Chapter 21, <u>full-time</u> speech language pathologists, full-time
- 12 audiologists, and full-time school nurses employed by the district
- 13 and entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402; and
- 14 (3) an amount equal to the product of \$275 multiplied
- 15 by the number of students in average daily attendance in grades nine
- 16 through 12 in the district.
- 17 SECTION 9. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 18 school year.
- 19 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
