4	SECTION 1. Chapter 264, Family Code, is amended by adding
5	Subchapter K to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER K. KINSHIP CAREGIVER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
7	Sec. 264.851. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Kinship caregiver" means a relative who provides
9	substitute care for a child for whom the department had been
10	appointed managing conservator, but who is not licensed or
11	certified to operate a foster home, foster group home, agency
12	foster home, or agency foster group home under Chapter 42, Human
13	Resources Code.
14	(2) "Relative" means a person related to a child by
15	consanguinity as determined under Section 573.022, Government
16	Code.
17	Sec. 264.852. RULES. (a) The executive commissioner shall
18	adopt rules necessary to implement the kinship caregiver assistance
19	program. The rules must:
20	(1) establish eligibility requirements to receive
21	kinship caregiver assistance benefits under the program; and
22	(2) provide for the amount of kinship caregiver
23	assistance payments under the program.
24	(b) In adopting rules regarding kinship caregiver

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1 assistance payments, the executive commissioner shall ensure that 2 kinship caregiver assistance payments are equal to the monetary assistance available for a foster care provider caring for the 3 child for whom the kinship caregiver is caring. 4 (c) To the extent permitted by federal law, the department 5 6 shall use federal funds available under Title IV-E, Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 670 et seq.), to administer the program under 7 8 this subchapter.

9 (d) A person may not concurrently receive kinship caregiver 10 assistance payments under this subchapter and relative caregiver 11 assistance under Subchapter I.

SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2009, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt rules for implementing and administering the kinship caregiver assistance program under Subchapter K, Chapter 264, Family Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
