7	(b) The fund consists of:
8	(1) appropriations or transfers made to the fund;
9	<pre>(2) unencumbered fund balances;</pre>
10	(3) public or private gifts <u>,</u> [or] grants <u>, or</u>
11	<pre>donations;</pre>
12	(4) investment income, including all interest,
13	dividends, capital gains, or other income from the investment of
14	any portion of the fund;
15	(5) repayments received on loans made from the fund;
16	and
17	(6) funds from any other source.
18	(c) The department may accept gifts, grants, or donations
19	for the housing trust fund. All funds received for the housing trust
20	fund under Subsection (b) shall be deposited or transferred into
21	the Texas Treasury Safekeeping Trust Company.
22	(d) In addition to other amounts appropriated to the housing

5	(e) The appropriations made by Senate Bill 1, Acts of the
6	81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009 (the General
7	Appropriations Act), out of the general revenue fund to the
8	Department of Information Resources are reduced by \$10 million for
9	the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2010, and are reduced by \$10
10	million for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2011.
11	(f) This subsection and Subsections (d) and (e) expire
12	September 1, 2012.
13	SECTION 2. To the extent of conflict and regardless of the
14	relative dates of enactment, this Act prevails over any other Act
