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- 2 relating to the collection and use of biometric identifiers.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 503.001, Business & Commerce Code, is
- 5 amended by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (c-1) and
- 6 (c-2) to read as follows:
- 7 (c) A person who possesses a biometric identifier of an
- 8 individual that is captured for a commercial purpose:
- 9 (1) may not sell, lease, or otherwise disclose the
- 10 biometric identifier to another person unless:
- 11 (A) the individual consents to the disclosure for
- 12 <u>identification purposes in the event of the individual's</u>
- 13 <u>disappearance or death;</u>
- 14 (B) the disclosure completes a financial
- 15 transaction that the individual requested or authorized;
- 16 (C) the disclosure is required or permitted by a
- 17 federal statute or by a state statute other than Chapter 552,
- 18 Government Code; or
- 19 (D) the disclosure is made by or to a law
- 20 enforcement agency for a law enforcement purpose in response to a
- 21 warrant; [and]
- 22 (2) shall store, transmit, and protect from disclosure
- 23 the biometric identifier using reasonable care and in a manner that
- 24 is the same as or more protective than the manner in which the

- 1 person stores, transmits, and protects any other confidential
- 2 information the person possesses; and
- 3 (3) shall destroy the biometric identifier within a
- 4 reasonable time, but not later than the first anniversary of the
- 5 date the purpose for collecting the identifier expires, except as
- 6 provided by Subsection (c-1).
- 7 (c-1) If a biometric identifier of an individual is used in
- 8 connection with an instrument or document that is required by
- 9 another law to be maintained for a period longer than the period
- 10 prescribed by Subsection (c)(3), the person who possesses the
- 11 biometric identifier shall destroy the biometric identifier within
- 12 a reasonable time, but not later than the first anniversary of the
- 13 date the instrument or document is no longer required to be
- 14 maintained by law.
- 15 <u>(c-2)</u> If a biometric identifier has been collected for
- 16 security purposes by an employer, the purpose for collecting the
- 17 identifier under Subsection (c)(3) is presumed to expire on
- 18 termination of the employment relationship.
- 19 SECTION 2. (a) The changes in law made by this Act apply to
- 20 a biometric identifier possessed by a person:
- 21 (1) on or after the effective date of this Act; or
- 22 (2) before the effective date of this Act, subject to
- 23 Subsection (b) of this section.
- 24 (b) A person who before the effective date of this Act
- 25 possesses a biometric identifier that is required to be destroyed
- 26 because of the changes in law made by this Act shall destroy the
- 27 biometric identifier on or before October 1, 2009.
