A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the collection and use of biometric identifiers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 503.001(c), Business & Commerce Code, as 4 effective April 1, 2009, is amended to read as follows: 5 6 (c) A person who possesses a biometric identifier of an individual: 7 (1) may not sell, lease, or otherwise disclose the 8 biometric identifier to another person unless: 9 (A) [the individual consents to the disclosure; 10 11 [(B)] the disclosure completes a financial 12 transaction that the individual requested or authorized; 13 (B) [(C)] the disclosure is required or 14 permitted by a federal statute or by a state statute other than Chapter 552, Government Code; or 15 16 (C) [(D)] the disclosure is made by or to a law enforcement agency for a law enforcement purpose in response to a 17 warrant; [and] 18 shall store, transmit, and protect from disclosure 19 (2) 20 the biometric identifier using reasonable care and in a manner that 21 is the same as or more protective than the manner in which the person stores, transmits, and protects any other confidential 22 23 information the person possesses; and 24 (3) shall destroy the biometric identifier within a

reasonable time not to exceed the first anniversary of the date the purpose for collecting the identifier expires.

3 SECTION 2. (a) Section 503.001(c), Business & Commerce 4 Code, as amended by this Act, applies to a biometric identifier 5 possessed by a person before the effective date of this Act, except 6 as provided by Subsection (b) of this section.

7 (b) A person who possesses a biometric identifier that is 8 required to be destroyed because of the change in law made by this 9 Act to Section 503.001(c), Business & Commerce Code, shall destroy 10 the biometric identifier on or before October 1, 2009.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
