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H.B. No. 3230

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the approval of out-of-state nursing education programs3 by the Texas Board of Nursing.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 301.157, Occupations Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsection (d-4) and adding Subsection (d-8) to read as 7 follows:

8 (d-4) The board may recognize and accept as approved under 9 this section a school of nursing or educational program operated in 10 another state and approved by a state board of nursing <u>or other</u> 11 <u>regulatory body</u> of another state. The board shall develop policies 12 to ensure that the other state board's standards are substantially 13 equivalent to the board's standards.

14 (d-8) A nursing program is considered to meet standards
15 substantially equivalent to the board's standards if the program:
16 (1) is part of an institution of higher education in

17 another state that is approved by the regulatory authorities of 18 that state;

19 (2) holds regional accreditation by an accrediting 20 body recognized by the United States secretary of education and the 21 Council for Higher Education Accreditation;

(3) holds specialty accreditation by an accrediting
body recognized by the United States secretary of education and the
Council for Higher Education Accreditation, including the National

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1 League for Nursing Accrediting Commission; 2 (4) requires for admission that an applicant be a licensed practical or vocational nurse, military service corpsman, 3 paramedic, or the holder of a degree in a clinically oriented health 4 5 care field with demonstrated experience providing direct patient care; and 6 7 (5) graduates students who: (A) achieve program outcomes determined by the 8 program's faculty, including passing a nursing examination that 9 10 tests knowledge essential to beginning practice as a registered 11 nurse; 12 (B) pass an examination, developed by the program's faculty subject matter experts, that measures clinical 13 14 competencies essential to beginning practice as a registered nurse and meets nationally recognized standards; and 15 16 (C) pass the National Council Licensure 17 Examination for Registered Nurses at a rate equivalent to the passage rate for students of board-approved in-state programs. 18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2.2 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
