A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of the sale and use of fireworks by certain counties; providing penalties. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 352, Local Government 5 Code, is amended by adding Section 352.052 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 352.052. ADDITIONAL REGULATION OF FIREWORKS IN CERTAIN COUNTIES. (a) This section applies only to a county with a 8 9 population of 3.3 million or more. (b) To promote public health, safety, and welfare, the 10 commissioners court of a county by order may prohibit or otherwise 11 regulate the sale or use of fireworks in the unincorporated area of 12 13 the county. 14 (c) A person who violates a prohibition or regulation adopted by the county under this section is liable to the county for 15 16 a civil penalty of not more than \$100 for each violation. Each day a violation continues is considered a separate violation for purposes 17 of assessing the civil penalty. A county may bring suit in a 18 district court to recover a civil penalty authorized by this 19 subsection. 20 21 (d) A person commits an offense if the person intentionally or knowingly violates a prohibition or regulation adopted under 22 23 this section by the commissioners court. An offense under this subsection is a Class C misdemeanor. 24

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(e) Authority under this section is cumulative of other
authority that a county has to regulate the sale or use of fireworks
and does not limit that other authority.

4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
