	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the Texas Partnership for Children in Nature.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 4, Government Code, is amended
5	by adding Chapter 450 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 450. TEXAS PARTNERSHIP FOR CHILDREN IN NATURE
7	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS
8	Sec. 450.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "partnership"
9	means the Texas Partnership for Children in Nature.
10	Sec. 450.002. SUNSET PROVISION. The Texas Partnership for
11	Children in Nature is subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act).
12	Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the
13	partnership is abolished and this chapter expires September 1,
14	<u>2021.</u>
15	Sec. 450.003. COMPOSITION OF PARTNERSHIP. The partnership
16	is composed of seven members as follows:
17	(1) three public members as follows, appointed by the
18	governor in consultation with the executive director of the Parks
19	and Wildlife Department and the commissioner of education:
20	(A) one public member who represents
21	parent-teacher organizations; and
22	(B) two public members each of whom represents a
23	nonprofit organization dedicated to education concerning or
24	protection of the environment; and

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1	(2) four ex officio members as follows:
2	(A) the executive director of the Parks and
3	Wildlife Department;
4	(B) the commissioner of education;
5	(C) the commissioner of state health services;
6	and
7	(D) the commissioner of agriculture.
8	Sec. 450.004. PUBLIC MEMBERS: ELIGIBILITY; APPOINTMENT;
9	VACANCY. (a) A person appointed as a public member of the
10	partnership must be a resident of this state.
11	(b) Appointments of public members to the partnership shall
12	be made:
13	(1) without regard to the race, color, disability,
14	sex, religion, age, or national origin of an appointee; and
15	(2) so that various geographic areas of this state are
16	represented in the partnership.
17	(c) The governor, in consultation with the executive
18	director of the Parks and Wildlife Department and the commissioner
19	of education, shall fill any vacancy in an appointed position in the
20	partnership for the unexpired portion of the term.
21	Sec. 450.005. EX OFFICIO MEMBERS: ELIGIBILITY; DESIGNATION
22	OF REPRESENTATIVE. (a) An ex officio member of the partnership
23	vacates the person's position in the partnership if the person
24	ceases to hold the position that qualifies the person for service in
25	the partnership.
26	(b) An ex officio member may designate a representative to
27	serve in the partnership in the member's place. A representative

No. 3271 1 designated under this subsection must be an officer or employee of 2 the state agency that employs the ex officio member or of which the 3 ex officio member is an officer. 4 Sec. 450.006. REMOVAL OF PUBLIC MEMBER. (a) It is a ground 5 for removal of a public member from the partnership if the member: 6 (1) is ineligible for public membership under Section 7 450.004(a); 8 (2) cannot because of illness or disability discharge the member's duties for a substantial part of the term for which the 9 10 member is appointed; or (3) is absent from more than two consecutive 11 12 partnership meetings that the member is eligible to attend during a calendar year unless the absence is excused by majority vote of the 13 14 members of the partnership. 15 (b) The validity of an action of the partnership is not affected by the fact that the action is taken when a ground for 16 17 removal of a partnership member exists. (c) If a member of the partnership has knowledge that a 18 potential ground for removal exists, the member shall notify the 19 presiding officer of the partnership of the potential ground. The 20 presiding officer shall then notify the governor and the attorney 21 22 general that a potential ground for removal exists. Sec. 450.007. TERM OF PUBLIC MEMBER. (a) A public member 23 24 of the partnership serves a term of two years. (b) A public member is eligible for reappointment to another 25 26 term or part of a term. 27 (c) A public member may not serve more than two consecutive

1	terms. For purposes of this prohibition, a member is considered to
2	have served a term only if the member has served more than half of
3	the term.
4	Sec. 450.008. OFFICERS; WORKING GROUPS. (a) The executive
5	director of the Parks and Wildlife Department or the executive
6	director's representative serves as the presiding officer of the
7	partnership.
8	(b) The presiding officer of the partnership may appoint one
9	or more working groups for any purpose consistent with the duties of
10	the partnership under this chapter.
11	Sec. 450.009. COMPENSATION; EXPENSES. (a) A public member
12	of the partnership is not entitled to compensation but is entitled
13	to reimbursement for the travel expenses incurred by the member
14	while transacting partnership business, as provided by the General
15	Appropriations Act.
16	(b) An ex officio member's service in the partnership is an
17	additional duty of the underlying position that qualifies the
18	member for service in the partnership. The entitlement of an ex
19	officio member to compensation or to reimbursement for travel
20	expenses incurred while transacting partnership business is
21	governed by the law that applies to the member's service in that
22	underlying position, and any payment to the member for either
23	purpose must be made from money that may be used for the purpose and
24	is available to the state agency that the member serves in that
25	underlying position.
26	Sec. 450.010. MEETINGS; VOTING; PUBLIC ACCESS. (a) The
27	partnership shall meet at the call of the presiding officer.

(b) An ex officio member of the partnership may vote on 1 partnership business. 2 3 (c) The partnership shall develop and implement policies that provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to appear 4 before the partnership and speak on any issue under the 5 jurisdiction of the partnership. 6 7 Sec. 450.011. STAFF COORDINATION. The Parks and Wildlife 8 Department shall provide staff support to the partnership, in coordination with the Texas Education Agency, the Department of 9 10 State Health Services, and the Texas Department of Agriculture. 11 [Sections 450.012-450.050 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES; FUNDING 12 Sec. 450.051. ADVISORY STATUS OF PARTNERSHIP. (a) 13 In 14 implementing its powers and duties under this chapter, the 15 partnership functions only in an advisory capacity. Membership in the partnership does not constitute a public office. 16 17 (b) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the partnership. Sec. 450.052. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF PARTNERSHIP. 18 19 (a) The partnership shall promote the well-being of this state's children by providing children with opportunities to spend more 20 time outdoors and to learn about the environment through 21 22 experiential activities outdoors and formal and informal education concerning the environment. To accomplish those purposes, the 23 24 partnership shall: 25 (1) develop and assist in the implementation of a plan 26 to provide children with structured and unstructured opportunities for outdoor recreation, scientific study, and learning that 27

1 i<u>ncludes:</u> 2 (A) development and implementation of strategies to provide increased support for programs under which school 3 grounds are converted into natural habitats for play and outdoor 4 5 classrooms; 6 (B) establishment of trail systems that connect 7 communities, parks, and schools to encourage walking, biking, and 8 increased time outdoors by children and their families; 9 (C) establishment of nature play areas in 10 communities to offer outdoor experiences close to children's homes; (D) establishment, in partnership with the 11 12 Department of Family and Protective Services, the advisory council on juvenile services, and appropriate community nonprofit 13 organizations, of a statewide civic justice corps to provide 14 students at risk of dropping out of school with opportunities to 15 serve on conservation crews in state parks and on other public land; 16 17 (E) establishment, in cooperation with school districts, local parks departments, and appropriate nonprofit 18 19 organizations, of an outdoor classroom program on public land that provides service learning opportunities and voluntary programming 20 aligned with the required curriculum under Section 28.002, 21 22 Education Code; (F) provision to children and their families of 23 increased access to naturalists who present interpretive 24 activities at state parks and on other public land to enhance 25 26 discovery and enjoyment of this state's natural resources; and 27 (G) provision to children who are members of

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1	minority groups of increased access to state parks and other public
2	land, through partnership with appropriate organizations;
3	(2) develop and assist in the implementation of a
4	state environmental literacy plan that includes:
5	(A) a review of current environmental education
6	in public schools, including student environmental literacy
7	levels;
8	(B) identification of curriculum necessary to
9	develop environmentally literate students;
10	(C) identification of model outdoor field and
11	service learning experiences that can be integrated into the
12	required curriculum under Section 28.002, Education Code;
13	(D) professional development opportunities for
14	professional educators and for students who are in educator
15	preparation programs and development programs for other
16	environmental educators; and
17	(E) methods to annually measure and report, at
18	the state and local levels, progress of public school students
19	toward becoming environmentally literate;
20	(3) devise a method to measure:
21	(A) baseline data concerning the amount of time
22	children spend outdoors; and
23	(B) any increased time children spend outdoors as
24	a result of the partnership's efforts; and
25	(4) identify opportunities for and barriers to
26	implementing environmental literacy programs in public schools and
27	on public land.

(b) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year, 1 the partnership shall submit a report to the governor, the 2 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, 3 and the presiding officer of each legislative standing committee 4 with primary jurisdiction over primary and secondary education, 5 natural resources, land and resource management, or environmental 6 7 regulation regarding the partnership's recommendations concerning 8 the partnership's duties under Subsection (a).

9 (c) The partnership shall adopt rules as necessary for its 10 own procedures.

11 <u>Sec. 450.053.</u> FUNDING. The partnership may accept gifts 12 and grants from a public or private source for the partnership to 13 use in performing the partnership's powers and duties under this 14 <u>chapter.</u>

15 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 16 of this Act, appointments of public members shall be made to the 17 Texas Partnership for Children in Nature as provided by Chapter 18 450, Government Code, as added by this Act. Notwithstanding 19 Section 450.007, Government Code, as added by this Act, the terms of 20 initial public members appointed to the Texas Partnership for 21 Children in Nature expire February 1, 2011.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
