A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to development of a strategy for increasing the number of
- 3 guidance counselors employed by public high schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. STRATEGY FOR INCREASING THE NUMBER OF HIGH
- 6 SCHOOL GUIDANCE COUNSELORS. (a) The Texas Education Agency shall
- 7 develop a strategy for increasing the number of certified guidance
- 8 counselors employed in public high schools so that each public high
- 9 school employs at least one certified guidance counselor for every
- 10 250 students.
- 11 (b) In developing the strategy, the agency shall:
- 12 (1) determine the current ratio in public high schools
- 13 of certified guidance counselors to students;
- 14 (2) estimate the number of additional certified
- 15 guidance counselors required to be employed to reach the goal
- 16 specified in Subsection (a) of this section;
- 17 (3) identify the steps necessary to be taken to reach
- 18 the goal specified in Subsection (a) of this section; and
- 19 (4) determine the date by which the goal specified in
- 20 Subsection (a) of this section could reasonably be achieved.
- 21 SECTION 2. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2010, the
- 22 Texas Education Agency shall submit a report to the legislature
- 23 regarding the strategy developed under Section 1 of this Act. The
- 24 report must contain:

- 1 (1) information regarding the costs of implementing
- 2 the strategy;
- 3 (2) recommendations regarding alternative options for
- 4 paying the costs identified in Subdivision (1) of this section; and
- 5 (3) recommendations regarding a timeline for gradual
- 6 implementation of the strategy.
- 7 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 8 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 9 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 10 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 11 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
