- SECTION 1. Section 51.3062(i), Education Code, is amended 5 to read as follows:
- 7 (i) The institution of higher education may refer a student
- to developmental coursework as considered necessary by the 8
- institution to address a student's deficiencies in the student's 9
- readiness to perform freshman-level academic coursework, except 10
- 11 that the institution may not require enrollment in developmental
- 12 coursework with respect to a student previously determined by any
- institution of higher education to have met college-readiness 13
- 14 standards. An institution of higher education that requires a
- student to enroll in developmental coursework must offer the 15
- 16 student the option of enrolling in developmental coursework in an

- 5 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 6 beginning with the 2010-2011 academic year.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
