- 5 SECTION 1. Section 42.29, Tax Code, is amended by amending
- 6 Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A property owner who prevails in an appeal to \underline{a} [the]
- 8 court under Section <u>42.01</u>, <u>42.02</u>, <u>42.031</u>, <u>42.25</u>, or 42.26 may be
- 9 awarded reasonable attorney's fees. The amount of the award may not
- 10 exceed the greater of:
- 11 (1) \$15,000; or
- 12 (2) 20 percent of the total amount by which the
- 13 property owner's tax liability is reduced as a result of the appeal.
- 14 (c) The limits on the amount of an award of attorney's fees
- 15 in Subsection (b) do not apply if the property that is the subject
- 16 of the appeal is a residence homestead that qualifies for an
- 17 exemption under Section 11.13.
- SECTION 2. The changes in law to Section 42.29, Tax Code,
- 19 made by this Act apply only to an appeal under Chapter 42, Tax Code,
- 20 that is filed on or after the effective date of this Act. An appeal
- 21 under Chapter 42, Tax Code, that was filed before the effective date
- 22 of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the appeal
- 23 was filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 24 purpose.

- 1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
