- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 664.061, Government Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 664.061. AGENCY WELLNESS POLICIES. (a) A state agency
- 7 may:
- 8 (1) allow each employee 30 minutes during normal
- 9 working hours for exercise three times each week;
- 10 (2) allow all employees to attend on-site wellness
- 11 seminars when offered; and
- 12 (3) provide <u>four</u> [eight] hours of additional leave
- 13 time each year to an employee who[+
- 14 $\left[\frac{A}{A}\right]$ receives a physical examination.
- 15 (b) A state agency shall, and an institution of higher
- 16 education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, may,
- 17 provide four hours of leave time each year to an employee who [; and
- 18 [(B)] completes either an online health risk
- 19 assessment tool provided by the board or a similar health risk
- 20 assessment conducted in person by a worksite wellness coordinator.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 1551.061, Insurance Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 1551.061. ANNUAL REPORTS [REPORT]. (a) The board of
- 24 trustees shall submit a written report not later than January 1 of

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- 1 each year to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the
- 2 house of representatives, and Legislative Budget Board concerning
- 3 the coverages provided and the benefits and services being received
- 4 by all participants under this chapter. The report must include
- 5 information about the effectiveness and efficiency of:
- 6 (1) managed care cost containment practices; and
- 7 (2) fraud detection and prevention procedures.
- 8 (b) The board of trustees shall submit a written report not
- 9 later than January 1 of each year to the governor and Legislative
- 10 Budget Board that includes:
- 11 (1) a population-based summary of the health risk
- 12 assessments completed under Section 664.061, Government Code,
- 13 during the preceding state fiscal year; and
- 14 (2) an evaluation of the Employees Retirement System
- of Texas' weight management programs.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
