A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the duties of the interagency obesity council and the Department of Agriculture relating to health, wellness, and 3 prevention of obesity. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 114, Health and Safety Code, is amended 6 to read as follows: 7 CHAPTER 114. INTERAGENCY OBESITY COUNCIL 8 Sec. 114.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "council" means 9 the interagency obesity council created by this chapter. 10 Sec. 114.002. INTERAGENCY OBESITY COUNCIL. The council is 11 12 composed of the [(a) The] commissioner of agriculture, the commissioner of state health services, and the commissioner of 13 14 education, or a staff member designated by each of those 15 commissioners. Sec. 114.003. CONTRACTS FOR ASSISTANCE. The council may 16 contract with a private or public university to assist in gathering 17 information under this chapter. 18 Sec. 114.004. GIFTS AND GRANTS. An agency represented on 19 20 the council may accept gifts and grants on behalf of the council. 21 Sec. 114.005. REVIEW OF AGENCY PROGRAMS. The council $[\tau]$ shall review [meet at least once a year as an interagency council 22 23 to: 24 [(1) discuss] the status of the [each agency's]

programs of the Department of Agriculture, the Department of State 1 Health Services, and the Texas Education Agency that promote better 2 3 health and nutrition and prevent obesity among children and adults in this state[; and 4 5 [(2) consider the feasibility of tax incentives for 6 employers who promote activities designed to reduce obesity in the 7 workforce]. 8 Sec. 114.006. EVIDENCE-BASED PUBLIC HEALTH AWARENESS PLAN. The council shall create an evidence-based public health 9 (a) awareness plan. In creating the plan, the council shall explore 10 past successful public health awareness efforts. 11 12 (b) The plan must include: (1) a cost estimate that accounts for continuing 13 14 implementation of the plan; 15 (2) recommendations on reaching populations that would most benefit from increased public health awareness; and 16 17 (3) recommendations on encouraging employers to participate in wellness programs for employees. 18 19 (c) The council shall solicit input on the plan from the private sector. 20 21 The council shall provide to the Department of State (d) Health Services information on effective strategies for employers 22 to use to promote workplace wellness, including information on the 23 24 projected costs and benefits. The Department of State Health Services shall post the information on its Internet website. 25 26 Sec. 114.007. STATE-ENDORSED HEALTHY FOOD AND BEVERAGE DESIGNATION. (a) The Department of Agriculture, in consultation 27

with the council, shall study the feasibility, practicality, and 1 potential benefit, cost, and revenue associated with creating a 2 state-endorsed "healthy food and beverage" designation. 3 4 (b) If the Department of Agriculture determines that the creation and implementation of a "healthy food and beverage" 5 designation is feasible, the department, in consultation with the 6 7 council, shall identify ways to note the following information on 8 qualifying products: 9 (1) serving size; 10 (2) nutrient class or family; and 11 (3) the role of the product as part of a healthy, 12 well-balanced diet. (c) Not later than January 15, 2011, the Department of 13 14 Agriculture shall submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant 15 governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives regarding the feasibility of creating and implementing a state-endorsed 16 "healthy food and beverage" designation. The report required under 17 this subsection may be included with the report of the council 18 19 required under Section 114.008. (d) The Department of Agriculture may contract with a 20 private or public university to assist in gathering information 21 22 under this section. 23 (e) This section expires September 2, 2011. 24 Sec. 114.008. REPORTS. (a) [(b)] Not later than January 15 of each odd-numbered year, the [interagency] council shall submit a 25 26 report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives on the activities of the council under 27

Sections 114.005 and 114.006 during the preceding two calendar 1 2 years. (b) [(c)] A report submitted by the [interagency] council 3 under Subsection (a) [(b)] must include the following information 4 5 regarding discussions of agency programs under Section 114.005: 6 (1) a list of the programs within each agency represented on the council that are designed to promote better 7 8 health and nutrition; an assessment of the steps taken by each program 9 (2)during the preceding two calendar years; 10 a report of the progress made by taking these steps 11 (3) 12 in reaching each program's goals; the areas of improvement that are needed in each 13 (4) 14 program; and 15 (5) recommendations for future goals or legislation. 16 (c) A report submitted by the council under Subsection (a) include the following information regarding the 17 must evidence-based public health awareness plan under Section 114.006: 18 19 (1) a cost estimate for an ongoing program to implement the plan; 20 21 (2) projected benefits of the program; 22 (3) a summary of the information provided to the Texas Department of State Health Services for its Internet website; and 23 24 (4) recommendations for goals and future legislation. Sec. 114.009. MEETINGS. (a) The council shall meet at 25 26 least once each year to perform its duties under Sections 114.005 27 and 114.006.
