A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to immunization requirements for children.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 81.023, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 81.023. IMMUNIZATION. (a) The executive commissioner
- 7 of the Health and Human Services Commission may recommend to the
- 8 legislature immunizations that may be added to the list of required
- 9 immunizations [board shall develop immunization requirements] for
- 10 children under Section 161.004, Sections 38.001 and 51.933,
- 11 Education Code, and Section 42.043, Human Resources Code.
- 12 (b) Control measures imposed by the department or a local
- 13 health authority under Section 81.082 during a public health
- 14 disaster may require immunizations other than those listed in
- 15 Section 161.004 only if the public health disaster occurs when the
- 16 legislature is not in session. If the legislature is called to
- 17 session during the disaster, the control measures requiring
- 18 immunizations have no effect unless the legislature approves the
- 19 control measures by joint resolution.
- 20 <u>(c)</u> The <u>executive commissioner of the Health and Human</u>
- 21 Services Commission [board] shall cooperate with the Department of
- 22 <u>Family and</u> Protective [and Regulatory] Services in <u>promoting</u>
- 23 [formulating and implementing] the immunization requirements for
- 24 children admitted to child-care facilities.

- 1 (d) [(c)] The executive commissioner of the Health and
- 2 Human Services Commission [board] shall cooperate with the State
- 3 Board of Education in promoting the [formulating and implementing]
- 4 immunization requirements for students admitted to public or
- 5 private primary or secondary schools.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 161.004(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d), each [Every] child
- 9 in the state shall be immunized against hepatitis B, diphtheria,
- 10 tetanus, pertussis, influenza, haemophilus influenzae type b,
- 11 pneumococcal disease, poliomyelitis, rubeola, mumps, rubella,
- 12 varicella, hepatitis A, and meningococcal disease [vaccine
- 13 preventable diseases caused by infectious agents] in accordance
- 14 with the [immunization] schedule adopted by the executive
- 15 <u>commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission. The</u>
- 16 <u>executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission</u>
- 17 may not require immunizations against any additional diseases
- 18 [board].
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 38.001, Education Code, as amended by
- 20 Chapters 43 (H.B. 1098) and 94 (H.B. 1059), Acts of the 80th
- 21 Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, is reenacted and amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 38.001. IMMUNIZATION; REQUIREMENTS; EXCEPTIONS. (a)
- 24 Except as provided by Subsection (c), each [Each] student shall be
- 25 fully immunized against diphtheria, rubeola, rubella, mumps,
- 26 tetanus, pertussis, varicella, hepatitis B, and poliomyelitis and,
- 27 for students attending a school in a high-incidence geographic area

- 1 as determined by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 2 <u>Services Commission</u>, hepatitis A [, except as provided by
- 3 Subsection (c)].
- 4 (b) The [Subject to Subsections (b-1) and (c), the]
- 5 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- 6 may not modify or delete any of the immunizations in Subsection (a)
- 7 and [or] may not require immunizations against additional diseases
- 8 as a requirement for admission to any elementary or secondary
- 9 school.
- 10 (b-1) Each year, the Department of State Health Services
- 11 shall prepare a list of the immunizations required under this
- 12 section for admission to public schools and of any additional
- 13 immunizations the department recommends for school-age children.
- 14 The department shall prepare the list in English and Spanish and
- 15 make the list available in a manner that permits a school district
- 16 to easily post the list on the district's Internet website as
- 17 required by Section 38.019.
- 18 (b-2) $[\frac{(b-1)}{}]$ Immunization against human papillomavirus is
- 19 not required for a person's admission to any elementary or
- 20 secondary school; however, by using existing resources, the Health
- 21 and Human Services Commission shall provide educational material
- 22 about the human papillomavirus vaccine that is unbiased, medically
- 23 and scientifically accurate, and peer reviewed, available to
- 24 parents or legal guardians at the appropriate time in the
- 25 immunization schedule by the appropriate school. This subsection
- 26 preempts any contrary executive order issued by the governor. This
- 27 subsection expires January 11, 2013 [2011].

- 1 (c) Immunization is not required for a person's admission to
- 2 any elementary or secondary school if the person applying for
- 3 admission:
- 4 (1) submits to the admitting official:
- 5 (A) an affidavit or a certificate signed by a
- 6 physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine
- 7 in the United States, in which it is stated that, in the physician's
- 8 opinion, the immunization required poses a significant risk to the
- 9 health and well-being of the applicant or any member of the
- 10 applicant's family or household; or
- 11 (B) an affidavit signed by the applicant or, if a
- 12 minor, by the applicant's parent or guardian stating that the
- 13 applicant declines immunization for reasons of conscience,
- 14 including a religious belief; or
- 15 (2) is a member of the armed forces of the United
- 16 States and is on active duty.
- 17 (c-1) An affidavit submitted under Section (c)(1)(B) must
- 18 be on a form described by Section 161.0041, Health and Safety Code,
- 19 and must be submitted to the admitting official not later than the
- 20 90th day after the date the affidavit is notarized.
- 21 (d) The Department of State Health Services shall provide
- 22 the required immunization to children in areas where no local
- 23 provision exists to provide those services.
- (e) A person may be provisionally admitted to an elementary
- 25 or secondary school if the person has begun the required
- 26 immunizations and if the person continues to receive the necessary
- 27 immunizations as rapidly as is medically feasible. The Department

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- 1 of State Health Services shall adopt rules relating to the
- 2 provisional admission of persons to an elementary or secondary
- 3 school.
- 4 (f) A person who has not received the immunizations required
- 5 by this section for reasons of conscience, including because of the
- 6 person's religious beliefs, may be excluded from school in times of
- 7 <u>a public health disaster as defined by Section 81.003, Health and</u>
- 8 Safety Code [emergency or epidemic declared by the commissioner of
- 9 public health].
- SECTION 4. Sections 51.933(b) and (e), Education Code, are
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (b) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 13 Services Commission [Texas Board of Health] may not require
- 14 immunizations against [the diseases listed in Subsection (a) and]
- 15 additional diseases for students at any institution of higher
- 16 education [who are pursuing a course of study in a human or animal
- 17 health profession, and the board may require those immunizations
- 18 for any students in times of an emergency or epidemic in a county
- 19 where the commissioner of public health has declared such an
- 20 emergency or epidemic].
- 21 (e) A person who has not received the immunizations required
- 22 by this section for reasons of conscience, including because of the
- 23 person's religious beliefs, may be excluded from school in times of
- 24 a public health disaster as defined by Section 81.003, Health and
- 25 Safety Code. [The exception provided by Subsection (d)(1)(B) does
- 26 not apply in a time of emergency or epidemic declared by the
- 27 commissioner of public health.

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- 1 SECTION 5. Sections 42.043(a), (b), and (c), Human
- 2 Resources Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The <u>executive commissioner of the Health and Human</u>
- 4 Services Commission [department] shall make rules for the
- 5 immunization of children in facilities regulated under this
- 6 chapter.
- 7 (b) Each [The department shall require that each] child at
- 8 an appropriate age shall [have a test for tuberculosis and] be
- 9 immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, poliomyelitis,
- 10 mumps, rubella, rubeola, <u>haemophilus influenzae type b, hepatitis</u>
- 11 B, varicella, [invasive] pneumococcal disease, and hepatitis A [and
- 12 against any other communicable disease] as recommended by the
- 13 Department of State Health Services. The immunization must be
- 14 effective on the date of first entry into the facility. However, a
- 15 child may be provisionally admitted if the required immunizations
- 16 have begun and are completed as rapidly as medically feasible.
- 17 (c) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 18 Services Commission [Texas Department of Health] shall make rules
- 19 for the provisional admission of children to facilities regulated
- 20 under this chapter. The executive commissioner of the Health and
- 21 $\underline{\text{Human Services Commission}}$ [and] may $\underline{\text{not}}$ modify or delete any of the
- 22 immunizations listed in Subsection (b) [of this section] or require
- 23 additional immunizations as a requirement for admission to a
- 24 facility.
- 25 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
