## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the cost of replacing a law enforcement officer during

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 772.006(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The governor shall establish a criminal justice
- 8 division in the governor's office to:
- 9 (1) advise and assist the governor in developing
- 10 policies, plans, programs, and proposed legislation for improving
- 11 the coordination, administration, and effectiveness of the
- 12 criminal justice system;
- 13 (2) administer the criminal justice planning fund;
- 14 (3) prepare a state comprehensive criminal justice
- 15 plan, to update the plan annually based on an analysis of the
- 16 state's criminal justice problems and needs, and to encourage
- 17 identical or substantially similar local and regional
- 18 comprehensive criminal justice planning efforts;
- 19 (4) establish goals, priorities, and standards for
- 20 programs and projects to improve the administration of justice and
- 21 the efficiency of law enforcement, the judicial system,
- 22 prosecution, criminal defense, and adult and juvenile corrections
- 23 and rehabilitation;
- 24 (5) award grants to state agencies, units of local

- 1 government, school districts, and private, nonprofit corporations
- 2 from the criminal justice planning fund for programs and projects
- 3 on consideration of the goals, priorities, and standards
- 4 recommended by the Criminal Justice Policy Council;
- 5 (6) apply for, obtain, and allocate for the purposes
- 6 of this section any federal or other funds which may be made
- 7 available for programs and projects that address the goals,
- 8 priorities, and standards established in local and regional
- 9 comprehensive criminal justice planning efforts or assist those
- 10 efforts;
- 11 (7) administer the funds provided by this section in
- 12 such a manner as to ensure that grants received under this section
- 13 do not supplant state or local funds;
- 14 (8) monitor and evaluate programs and projects funded
- 15 under this section, cooperate with and render technical assistance
- 16 to state agencies and local governments seeking to reduce crime or
- 17 enhance the performance and operation of the criminal justice
- 18 system, and collect from any state or local government entity
- 19 information, data, statistics, or other material necessary to carry
- 20 out the purposes of this section;
- 21 (9) submit a biennial report to the legislature
- 22 reporting the division's activities during the preceding biennium
- 23 including the comprehensive state criminal justice plans and other
- 24 studies, evaluations, crime data analyses, reports, or proposed
- 25 legislation that the governor determines appropriate or the
- 26 legislature requests; [and]
- 27 (10) pay, on application by a unit of local

- 1 government, the cost incurred to replace a law enforcement officer
- 2 during the period that the law enforcement officer is receiving
- 3 training by the federal Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agency,
- 4 or its successor agency, on the enforcement of federal immigration
- 5 law; and
- 6 (11) perform other duties as necessary to carry out
- 7 the duties listed in this subsection and adopt rules and procedures
- 8 as necessary.
- 9 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 10 772.006(a), Government Code, apply only to training that occurs on
- 11 or after the effective date of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
