- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 418.001, Property Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 418.001. GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION. A person,
- 8 including a builder or a person who is designated as a builder's
- 9 agent under Section 416.006, or a person who owns or controls a
- 10 majority ownership interest in the builder is subject to
- 11 disciplinary action under this chapter for:
- 12 (1) fraud or deceit in obtaining a registration or
- 13 certification under this subtitle;
- 14 (2) misappropriation or misapplication of trust funds
- 15 in the practice of residential construction, including a violation
- 16 of Chapter 32, Penal Code, or Chapter 162, if found by a final
- 17 nonappealable court judgment;
- 18 (3) naming false consideration in a contract to sell a
- 19 new home or in a construction contract;
- 20 (4) discriminating on the basis of race, color,
- 21 religion, sex, national origin, or ancestry;
- 22 (5) publishing a false or misleading advertisement;
- 23 (6) failure to honor, within a reasonable time, a
- 24 check issued to the commission, or any other instrument of payment,

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- 1 including a credit or debit card or electronic funds transfer,
- 2 after the commission has sent by certified mail a request for
- 3 payment to the person's last known business address, according to
- 4 commission records;
- 5 (7) failure to pay an administrative penalty assessed
- 6 by the commission under Chapter 419 or a fee due under Chapter 426;
- 7 (8) failure to pay a final nonappealable court
- 8 judgment arising from a construction defect or other transaction
- 9 between the person and a homeowner;
- 10 (9) failure to register a home as required by Section
- 11 426.003;
- 12 (10) failure to remit the fee for registration of a
- 13 home under Section 426.003;
- 14 (11) failure to reimburse a homeowner the amount
- ordered by the commission as provided by Section 428.004(d);
- 16 (12) engaging in statutory or common-law fraud or
- 17 misappropriation of funds, as determined by the commission after a
- 18 hearing under Section 418.003;
- 19 (13) a repeated failure to participate in the
- 20 state-sponsored inspection and dispute resolution process if
- 21 required by this title;
- 22 (14) failure to register as a builder as required
- 23 under Chapter 416;
- 24 (15) using or attempting to use a certificate of
- 25 registration that has expired or that has been revoked;
- 26 (16) falsely representing that the person holds a
- 27 certificate of registration issued under Chapter 416;

- 1 (17) acting as a builder using a name other than the
- 2 name or names disclosed to the commission;
- 3 (18) aiding, abetting, or conspiring with a person who
- 4 does not hold a certificate of registration to evade the provisions
- 5 of this title or rules adopted under this title, if found by a final
- 6 nonappealable court judgment;
- 7 (19) allowing the person's certificate of registration
- 8 to be used by another person;
- 9 (20) acting as an agent, partner, or associate of a
- 10 person who does not hold a certificate of registration with the
- 11 intent to evade the provisions of this title or rules adopted under
- 12 this title;
- 13 (21) a failure to reasonably perform on an accepted
- 14 offer to repair or a repeated failure to make an offer to repair
- 15 based on:
- 16 (A) the recommendation of a third-party
- 17 inspector under Section 428.004; or
- 18 (B) the final holding of an appeal under Chapter
- 19 429;
- 20 (22) a repeated failure to respond to a commission
- 21 request for information;
- 22 (23) a failure to obtain a building permit required by
- 23 a political subdivision before constructing a new home or an
- 24 improvement to an existing home;
- 25 (24) abandoning, without justification, any home
- 26 improvement contract or new home construction project engaged in or
- 27 undertaken by the person, if found to have done so by a final,

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- 1 nonappealable court judgment;
- 2 (25) a repeated failure to comply with the
- 3 requirements of Subtitle F; [or]
- 4 (26) failure to substantially complete all the
- 5 obligations under an express contract for construction without
- 6 reasonable grounds for the failure, if found to have done so by a
- 7 final, nonappealable court judgment; or
- 8 (27) otherwise violating this title or a commission
- 9 rule adopted under this title.
- SECTION 2. Section 418.001, Property Code, as amended by
- 11 this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after the
- 12 effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the
- 13 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 14 immediately before that date, and that law is continued in effect
- 15 for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
