H.B. No. 3420

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to computation of a public high school student's grade 3 point average. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 28.0252(b), Education Code, is amended 5 to read as follows: 6 7 (b) If the commissioner develops a standard method under this section, a school district shall use the standard method to 8 9 compute a student's high school grade point average[, except that to the extent of a conflict between that method and the method 10 adopted under Section 51.807, the student's grade point average 11 computed in accordance with the method established under Section 12 13 51.807 shall be used in determining the student's eligibility for 14 university admission under Subchapter U, Chapter 51]. SECTION 2. Section 51.807, Education Code, as amended by 15 Chapters 941 (H.B. 3826) and 1369 (H.B. 3851), Acts of the 80th 16 Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, is reenacted and amended to 17 18 read as follows: Sec. 51.807. RULEMAKING. [(a) To ensure a uniform standard 19 for admissions under this subchapter, the Texas Higher Education 20 21 Coordinating Board shall adopt rules establishing a standard method for computing a student's high school grade point average. The 22 23 method established under this subsection: [<u>(1) must:</u> 24

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1	[(A) be based on a four-point scale; and
2	[(B) assign additional weight for each honors
3	course, advanced placement course, international baccalaureate
4	course, or dual credit course completed by the student as the board
5	considers appropriate, taking into consideration the academic
6	rigor of each course completed by the student; and
7	[(2) may result in a student having a grade point
8	average higher than 4.0 on a four-point scale as a result of the
9	assignment of additional weight for one or more courses completed
10	by a student under Subdivision (1)(B).
11	[(b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, after
12	consulting with the Texas Education Agency, by rule shall establish
13	standards for determining for purposes of this subchapter:
14	[(1) whether a private high school is accredited by a
15	generally recognized accrediting organization; and
16	[(2) whether a person completed a high school
17	curriculum that is equivalent in content and rigor to the
18	curriculum requirements established under Section 28.025 for the
19	recommended or advanced high school program.
20	[(c)] The board may adopt [other] rules relating to the
21	operation of admissions programs under this subchapter[$ frac{ heta}$ including
22	rules relating to the identification of eligible students.
23	[(d) The standard method established under Subsection (a)
24	for computing a student's high school grade point average applies
25	to computing the grade point average of a student applying as a
26	first-time freshman for admission to a general academic teaching
27	institution beginning with admissions for the 2009 fall semester.

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1 This subsection expires January 1, 2010].

2 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies 3 beginning with admissions to a general academic teaching 4 institution for the 2010-2011 academic year. Admissions for an 5 academic period preceding that academic year are covered by the law 6 in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the 7 prior law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
