A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to educator preparation programs and educator
- 3 certification, performance, and recruitment.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.041, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (c) The board shall propose a rule adopting a fee for the
- 9 issuance and maintenance of an educator certificate that, when
- 10 combined with any fees imposed under Subsection (d), is adequate to
- 11 cover the cost of administration of this subchapter.
- 12 (d) The board may propose a rule adopting a fee for the
- 13 approval or renewal of approval of an educator preparation program,
- 14 or for the addition of a certificate or field of certification to
- 15 the scope of a program's approval. A fee imposed under this
- 16 subsection may not exceed the amount necessary, as determined by
- 17 the board, to provide for the administrative cost of approving,
- 18 renewing the approval of, and appropriately ensuring the
- 19 accountability of educator preparation programs under this
- 20 <u>subchapter</u>.
- 21 (e) The board's rules under Subsection (b)(2) must limit the
- 22 <u>duration of an emergency certificate</u>. The board may provide for
- 23 exceptions from the limitation specified by the board in
- 24 appropriate circumstances.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 21.043, Education Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 21.043. ACCESS TO INFORMATION [PEIMS DATA]. (a) The
- 4 agency shall provide the board with access to data obtained under
- 5 the Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS).
- 6 (b) Notwithstanding Section 21.355, a document evaluating
- 7 the performance of a teacher or administrator shall be provided to
- 8 the agency or board for purposes of this subchapter on request by
- 9 the agency or board. The agency or board, as appropriate, shall
- 10 take appropriate measures to maintain confidentiality of the
- 11 document.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 21.044, Education Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- Sec. 21.044. EDUCATOR PREPARATION. (a) A person may not be
- 15 admitted to an educator preparation program, including an
- 16 undergraduate university program, alternative certification
- 17 program, or postbaccalaureate program, unless the person:
- 18 (1) has an overall grade point average of at least 2.5
- 19 on a four-point scale or the equivalent or a grade point average of
- 20 at least 2.5 on a four-point scale or the equivalent for the most
- 21 recent 60 semester credit hours completed by the person; and
- 22 (2) demonstrates, in the manner determined by the
- 23 board, basic skills in reading, writing, and mathematics.
- 24 (b) The board shall propose rules establishing the training
- 25 requirements a person must accomplish to obtain a certificate,
- 26 enter an internship, or enter an induction-year program. The board
- 27 shall specify the minimum academic qualifications required for a

- 1 certificate.
- 2 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 3 amended by amending Section 21.045 and adding Sections 21.0451,
- 4 21.0452, 21.0453, 21.0454, and 21.0486 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 21.045. ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM FOR EDUCATOR
- 6 PREPARATION PROGRAMS. (a) The board shall propose rules
- 7 establishing standards to govern the approval and continuing
- 8 accountability of all educator preparation programs based on
- 9 information that is disaggregated with respect to sex and ethnicity
- 10 and that includes:
- 11 (1) results of the certification examinations
- 12 prescribed under Section 21.048(a); [and]
- 13 (2) performance based on the appraisal system for
- 14 beginning teachers adopted by the board;
- 15 (3) achievement, including improvement in
- 16 <u>achievement</u>, of students taught by beginning teachers for the first
- 17 three years following certification, as determined on the basis of
- 18 the measure of annual improvement under Section 39.034 and any
- other factor considered appropriate by the board; and
- 20 (4) perseverance of beginning teachers in the
- 21 profession, as determined on the basis of the number of beginning
- 22 teachers who maintain status as active contributing members in the
- 23 Teacher Retirement System of Texas for at least three years after
- 24 certification in comparison to similar programs.
- 25 (b) Each educator preparation program shall submit data
- 26 elements as required by the board for an annual performance report
- 27 to ensure access and equity. At a minimum, the annual report must

- 1 contain the performance data from Subsection (a), other than the
- 2 data required for purposes of Subsection (a)(3), and the following
- 3 information, disaggregated by sex and ethnicity:
- 4 (1) the number of candidates who apply;
- 5 (2) the number of candidates admitted;
- 6 (3) the number of candidates retained;
- 7 (4) the number of candidates completing the program;
- 8 (5) the number of candidates employed in the 9 profession after completing the program; and
- 10 (6) the number of candidates retained in the 11 profession.
- 12 (c) The board shall propose rules establishing performance
- 13 standards for the Accountability System for Educator Preparation
- 14 for accrediting educator preparation programs. At a minimum,
- 15 performance standards must be based on Subsection (a). The board
- 16 may propose rules establishing minimum standards for approval or
- 17 <u>renewal of approval of:</u>
- 18 <u>(1) educator preparation programs;</u>
- 19 (2) certification fields authorized to be offered by
- 20 an educator preparation program; or
- 21 (3) physical locations at which an educator
- 22 preparation program operates.
- 23 <u>(d) The board shall propose rules establishing standards</u>
- 24 for the designation of high-performance educator preparation
- 25 programs as recognized or exemplary.
- Sec. 21.0451. SANCTIONS UNDER ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM FOR
- 27 EDUCATOR PREPARATION PROGRAMS. (a) The board shall propose rules

- 1 for the sanction of educator preparation programs that do not meet
- 2 accountability standards and shall annually review the
- 3 accreditation status of each educator preparation program. The
- 4 rules:
- 5 (1) may provide for the agency to take any necessary
- 6 action, including one or more of the following actions:
- 7 (A) requiring the program to obtain technical
- 8 assistance approved by the agency or board;
- 9 (B) requiring the program to obtain professional
- 10 <u>services under contract with another person;</u>
- (C) appointing a monitor to participate in and
- 12 report to the board on the activities of the program;
- 13 (D) appointing a conservator to direct the
- 14 operations of the program;
- (E) if a program is rated as unacceptable under
- 16 the Accountability System for Educator Preparation, appointing a
- 17 board of managers to exercise the powers and duties of the governing
- 18 body of the program with respect to the program; and
- 19 (F) if a program has been rated as unacceptable
- 20 under the Accountability System for Educator Preparation for two
- 21 consecutive rating periods, revoking the approval of the program
- 22 and ordering the program to be closed, provided that the board or
- 23 agency must provide the opportunity for a hearing before the
- 24 effective date of the closure; and
- 25 (2) shall provide for the agency to revoke the
- 26 approval of the program and order the program to be closed if the
- 27 program has been rated as unacceptable under the Accountability

- 1 System for Educator Preparation for three consecutive rating
- 2 periods, provided that the board or agency must provide the
- 3 opportunity for a hearing before the effective date of the closure.
- 4 (b) Any action authorized or required to be taken against an
- 5 educator preparation program under Subsection (a) may also be taken
- 6 with regard to a particular field of certification authorized to be
- 7 offered by an educator preparation program.
- 8 (c) A conservator or board of managers appointed under
- 9 Subsection (a) may:
- 10 (1) direct any action to be taken by the educator
- 11 preparation program;
- 12 (2) disapprove any action taken by the educator
- 13 preparation program; or
- 14 (3) take any action on behalf of the educator
- 15 preparation program.
- 16 (d) A permissive revocation under Subsection (a)(1) or
- 17 required revocation under Subsection (a)(2) must be effective for a
- 18 period of at least two years. After two years, the program may seek
- 19 renewed approval to prepare educators for state certification.
- 20 (e) The costs of technical assistance required under
- 21 <u>Subsection (a)(1)(A) or the costs associated with the appointment</u>
- 22 of a monitor, conservator, or board of managers under Subsection
- 23 (a)(1)(C), (D), or (E) shall be paid by the sponsor of the educator
- 24 preparation program.
- Sec. 21.0452. REVIEW OF EDUCATOR PREPARATION PROGRAMS. (a)
- 26 The board and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 27 biennially shall conduct a review and assessment of the performance

- 1 of educator preparation programs and issue reports of the resulting
- 2 evaluations of the programs. The review and assessment may be
- 3 conducted in conjunction with an independent entity with experience
- 4 and expertise in research regarding effective instructional
- 5 techniques and the preparation of educators.
- 6 (b) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to
- 7 implement this section [(d) The executive director of the board
- 8 shall appoint an oversight team of educators to make
- 9 recommendations and provide assistance to educator preparation
- 10 programs that do not meet accreditation standards. If, after one
- 11 year, an educator preparation program has not fulfilled the
- 12 recommendations of the oversight team, the executive director shall
- 13 appoint a person to administer and manage the operations of the
- 14 program. If the program does not improve after two years, the board
- 15 shall revoke the approval of the program to prepare educators for
- 16 state certification].
- 17 Sec. 21.0453. CONSUMER INFORMATION REGARDING EDUCATOR
- 18 PREPARATION PROGRAMS. (a) To assist persons interested in
- 19 obtaining teaching certification in selecting an educator
- 20 preparation program, the board shall make available through the
- 21 board's Internet website consumer information regarding educator
- 22 preparation programs available in this state.
- 23 (b) The board shall determine the specific information made
- 24 available but shall make efforts to ensure that the following
- 25 information is provided for each educator preparation program:
- 26 (1) the average academic qualifications possessed by
- 27 persons admitted to the program or other information indicating the

- 1 quality of persons admitted to the program; and
- 2 (2) the degree to which persons who complete the
- 3 program are successful in obtaining teaching positions.
- 4 (c) The board may require an educator preparation program to
- 5 provide information to the board for purposes of this section.
- 6 Sec. 21.0454. TEXAS TEACHING SCHOLARS PROGRAM. (a) The
- 7 board by rule shall establish the Texas Teaching Scholars program
- 8 to provide for the recognition and support of not more than three
- 9 educator preparation programs in this state that are exceptionally
- 10 effective in preparing persons to enter the teaching profession.
- 11 (b) The board shall select educator preparation programs
- 12 for participation in the Texas Teaching Scholars program based on
- 13 applications submitted by interested educator preparation
- 14 programs. Any type of educator preparation program may apply,
- 15 <u>including traditional programs</u>, alternative programs, and programs
- 16 <u>developed by school districts.</u>
- 17 (c) Applications submitted under Subsection (b) must be
- 18 evaluated on a competitive basis according to criteria established
- 19 by the board. To the extent feasible, the board shall attempt to
- 20 select diverse types of educator preparation programs. The
- 21 <u>criteria established by the board must require that a selected</u>
- 22 <u>educator preparation program:</u>
- 23 (1) require persons seeking admission to the educator
- 24 preparation program to meet high academic standards for admission
- 25 and maintain high academic standards after admission;
- 26 (2) focus on subject area knowledge especially
- 27 necessary to teach at the secondary school level;

- 1 (3) provide for field work and training in
- 2 instructional design and classroom management;
- 3 (4) provide professional support during the initial
- 4 years in the teaching profession for persons who complete the
- 5 educator preparation program; and
- 6 (5) enter into partnerships with school districts to
- 7 <u>facilitate placement in teaching positions of persons who complete</u>
- 8 the educator preparation program.
- 9 (d) The board shall rigorously monitor the performance of
- 10 <u>each educator preparation program selected for participation in the</u>
- 11 Texas Teaching Scholars program to ensure that the educator
- 12 preparation program continues to meet standards established by the
- 13 board. The board may terminate an educator preparation program's
- 14 participation in the Texas Teaching Scholars program if the
- 15 <u>educator preparation program ceases to meet those standards.</u>
- (e) For purposes of Subsection (d), the board may require
- 17 each selected educator preparation program to provide any
- 18 information regarding the educator preparation program requested
- 19 by the board, including information relating to the academic
- 20 performance of students receiving instruction from persons who
- 21 <u>completed the educator preparation program.</u>
- 22 <u>(f) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated for</u>
- 23 the purpose, the board shall provide grants to each selected
- 24 educator preparation program to enable the educator preparation
- 25 program to expand and prepare additional persons to enter the
- 26 teaching profession.
- Sec. 21.0486. TEXAS PERFORMANCE CERTIFICATION. (a) The

- 1 board, in conjunction with the commissioner, may establish a Texas
- 2 performance certification program as an option for persons entering
- 3 the teaching profession.
- 4 (b) Under the program, the board and commissioner may
- 5 provide that a person who elects to receive a Texas performance
- 6 certificate is entitled to receive various incentives in exchange
- 7 for complying with requirements that are designed to ensure a high
- 8 <u>level of performance in the classroom.</u>
- 9 (c) The board may propose rules and the commissioner may
- 10 adopt rules necessary to implement the program authorized under
- 11 this section.
- 12 SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 13 amended by adding Section 21.061 to read as follows:
- 14 <u>Sec. 21.061. TEACHER RECRUITMENT</u> CAMPAIGN. (a) The board
- 15 <u>shall develop and implement a comprehensive statewide media</u>
- 16 campaign to recruit qualified persons to enter the teaching
- 17 profession.
- 18 (b) The campaign shall:
- 19 (1) give emphasis to recruiting persons from all
- 20 levels to teach in the subject areas of mathematics and science; and
- 21 (2) include a component that encourages students at or
- 22 below the college level to obtain degrees in the subject areas of
- 23 mathematics and science and seek subsequent certification to teach
- 24 in those subject areas.
- 25 (c) The board shall coordinate with the Texas Higher
- 26 Education Coordinating Board as necessary in developing and
- 27 implementing the campaign.

- 1 (d) The board shall solicit and may accept grants, gifts,
- 2 and donations from public and private entities to pay the costs of
- 3 developing and implementing the campaign.
- 4 SECTION 6. Section 21.352, Education Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 6 (e) In addition to appraising teachers in accordance with
- 7 this section, a school district may review the performance of a
- 8 teacher during the teacher's first year in the teaching profession
- 9 to identify the teacher's initial strengths and weaknesses and
- 10 offer any necessary suggestions for improvement.
- 11 SECTION 7. Section 21.553(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 (c) The State Board for Educator Certification shall
- 14 propose rules establishing criteria for awarding financial
- 15 incentives under this section, including criteria for awarding
- 16 financial incentives if there are more participants than funds
- 17 available to provide the financial incentives. The criteria for
- 18 awarding financial incentives in circumstances involving
- 19 insufficient available funding must provide that the highest
- 20 priority is given to participants with exceptional academic
- 21 qualifications, as determined by the board, who seek certification
- 22 <u>in the subject area of mathematics or science.</u>
- SECTION 8. Section 21.044(a)(2), Education Code, as added
- 24 by this Act, applies only to a person who seeks admission to an
- 25 educator preparation program that begins instruction on or after
- 26 January 1, 2010.
- 27 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
