13	(EFNEP), which provides nutrition education for economically
14	disadvantaged families;
15	(2) the Better Living for Texans (BLT) program, a
16	component of the United States Department of Agriculture's
17	Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), which provides
18	education programs to food stamp recipients, applicants, and other
19	approved audiences to help improve their ability to plan and
20	prepare nutritious meals, spend food dollars efficiently, and
21	prepare and store food safely; and
22	(3) other similar programs as determined by the
23	extension service.
24	(b) Not later than December 15 of each even-numbered year,

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1	the extension service shall make a presentation and provide a
2	report regarding each program administered under Subsection (a) to
3	the commissioner of education, the commissioner of agriculture, and
4	the commissioner of the Department of State Health Services, and to
5	any council in which representatives from all three agencies headed
