## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to creation of the Texas Armed Services Scholarship
3	Program.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 56, Education Code is amended by adding a
6	new Subchapter R to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER R. TEXAS ARMED SERVICES SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
8	Section 56.501 PROGRAM NAME
9	The scholarship program authorized by this subchapter is
10	known as the Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program.
11	Section 56.502 ARMED SERVICES SCHOLARSHIPS
12	Armed Services Scholarships are annual conditional
13	scholarship grants of \$15,000, available for use at any Texas
14	public institution of higher education having a Reserve Officer
15	Training Corps (R.O.T.C.) program, conditioned on certain
16	obligations to which the recipient is committed detailed at
17	section. 56.504.
18	Any amount paid to a student for being under contract with one
19	of the branches of the armed services of the United States shall be
20	deducted from the Armed Services Scholarship.
21	Section 56.503 POWERS OF APPOINTMENT
22	The Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the members of the
23	Texas Senate, and the members of the Texas House of Representative
24	shall each individually have the power annually to appoint two

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1 recipients of Armed Services scholarships who possess the requisite 2 qualifications for the scholarship. Section 56.504 QUALIFICATIONS 3 4 In order to qualify for an Armed Services Scholarship, a 5 student must meet minimum college entrance requirements at a 6 (1)7 Texas public university; and attend, meet and maintain the satisfactory 8 (2) academic progress requirements of the student's Texas public 9 10 university. Section 56.505 COMMITMENTS 11 12 In order to fulfill the student's commitments to the Armed Services Scholarship program, he or she must: 13 14 (1)complete four years of ROTC training, and graduate 15 within five years; 16 upon graduation, enter into either a four year (2) 17 commitment to be a member of the Texas State Guard or the Texas Army or Air Force National Guard, or a contract to serve as a 18 19 commissioned officer with any branch of the armed services of the 20 United States; and 21 meet the physical examination requirements and all (3) other pre-screening requirements of the Texas State Guard, the 22 Texas Army or Air Force National Guard , or of the branch of the 23 24 armed services with which the student enters into a contract. Section 56.506 CONSEQUENCES OF FAILURE TO MEET COMMITMENTS 25 26 If at any time, a recipient of an Armed Services Scholarship either fails to maintain satisfactory academic progress, withdraws 27

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from the scholarship program, or fails to fulfill his or her 1 2 commitment to the Texas State Guard or the Texas Army or Air Force National Guard or his or her contract with a branch of the armed 3 services of the United States, for any reason other than a physical 4 inability to meet any of these commitments, all funds advanced to 5 6 the recipient to that point under the Armed Services Scholarship 7 Program shall become a debt due and owing to the State of Texas. Section 56.507 FUNDING 8 9 The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may (a) solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any public or 10 private source for the purposes of this subchapter. 11 12 (b) The legislature may appropriate money for the purpose of this subchapter. 13 14 Section 56.508 RULE-MAKING AUTHORITY 15 The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall have authority to make rules to implement the purposes of this 16 17 subchapter.

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18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
