SECTION 3.06. The changes in law made by this article to Sections 11.02361 and 11.02362, Water Code, in the appointment and 8-15 8-16 8-17 qualifications of members of the Texas environmental flows science advisory committee, a basin and bay area stakeholders committee, 8-18 and a basin and bay expert science team do not affect the entitlement of a member serving on a committee or team immediately 8-19 8-20 8-21 before the effective date of this article to continue to serve and 8-22 function as a member of the committee or team for the remainder of the member's term.
