A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of the practice of
- 3 dietetics and nutrition care services.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 701.001, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 701.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as the
- 8 Texas Dietetics and Nutrition Practice [Licensed Dietitian] Act.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 701.002, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 10 amending Subdivisions (3), (4), (6), (7), and (8) and adding
- 11 Subdivision (6-a) to read as follows:
- 12 (3) "Dietetics" means the <u>integration</u> and application
- 13 of [professional discipline of applying and integrating]
- 14 scientific principles of food, nutrition, biochemistry,
- 15 physiology, management, and behavioral and social sciences under
- 16 different health, social, cultural, physical, psychological, and
- 17 economic conditions for the proper nourishment, care, and education
- 18 of an individual or group throughout the life cycle to achieve and
- 19 maintain human health. The term includes the development,
- 20 management, and provision of nutrition services.
- 21 (4) "Dietitians board" means the Texas [State] Board
- 22 of Dietetics and Nutrition [Examiners of Dietitians].
- 23 (6) "Nutrition assessment" means evaluating the
- 24 nutrition [nutritional] needs of an individual or group, using

- 1 relevant data, to make appropriate nutrition recommendations
- 2 [based on appropriate biochemical, anthropometric, physical, and
- 3 dietary data to determine nutrient needs and recommend appropriate
- 4 nutritional intake, including enteral and parenteral nutrition].
- 5 (6-a) "Nutrition care services" means all nutrition
- 6 services provided by a licensed dietitian in each area of practice,
- 7 including assessment, evaluation, counseling, research, education,
- 8 monitoring, consultation, development, and implementation of food
- 9 and nutrition-related services.
- 10 (7) "Nutrition counseling" means advising and
- 11 assisting an individual or group on appropriate <u>nutrition-related</u>
- 12 behavior by integrating information from the nutrition assessment
- 13 [nutritional intake by integrating information from a nutrition
- 14 assessment with information on food and other sources of nutrients
- 15 and meal preparation consistent with cultural background and
- 16 socioeconomic status].
- 17 (8) "Practice of dietetics and nutrition care
- 18 [Nutrition] services" includes [means]:
- 19 (A) assessing the <u>nutrition</u> [nutritional] needs
- 20 of an individual or group based on biochemical, anthropometric,
- 21 physical, and dietary data, [and] determining constraints and
- 22 resources to meet the nutrition needs of an individual or group, and
- 23 recommending proper nutrition intervention, including specialized
- 24 nutrition support such as determining nutrient needs for enteral
- 25 and parenteral nutrition and monitoring to evaluate patient
- 26 response to that treatment [in the practice];
- 27 (B) establishing priorities, objectives, and

- 1 goals that meet the nutrition [nutritional] needs of the individual
- 2 or group based on [and are consistent with] constraints and
- 3 available resources;
- 4 (C) providing nutrition education and counseling
- 5 in health and disease;
- 6 (D) developing, implementing, and managing <u>food</u>
- 7 <u>and nutrition</u> [nutritional] care services [systems]; [or]
- 8 (E) evaluating, adjusting [changing], and
- 9 maintaining appropriate quality standards in dietetics [food] and
- 10 <u>nutrition</u> [<u>nutritional</u>] care services; and
- 11 (F) providing medical nutrition therapy in
- 12 accordance with 42 U.S.C. Section 1395x(vv).
- SECTION 3. Section 701.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- Sec. 701.003. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Texas [State]
- 16 Board of Dietetics and Nutrition [Examiners of Dietitians] is
- 17 subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless
- 18 continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the board is
- 19 abolished September 1, 2017.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 701, Occupations Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Sections 701.004 and 701.005 to read as follows:
- Sec. 701.004. EXEMPTIONS. (a) This chapter does not apply
- 23 to a person who is a:
- 24 (1) retailer that furnishes oral or written general
- 25 <u>nutrition information to a customer on food, food materials,</u>
- 26 dietary supplements, or other goods sold at the retailer's
- 27 establishment in connection with the marketing and distribution of

- 1 those goods at the retailer's establishment;
- 2 (2) person that furnishes oral or written general
- 3 nutrition information on food, food materials, or dietary
- 4 supplements;
- 5 (3) person engaged in the practice of the tenets of any
- 6 religion, sect, or denomination that furnishes oral or written
- 7 general nutrition information on food, food materials, or dietary
- 8 supplements;
- 9 (4) person who disseminates oral or written general
- 10 nutrition information, conducts a class or seminar, or gives a
- 11 speech related to dietetics and nutrition care services;
- 12 (5) licensed health care professional practicing
- 13 within the person's scope of practice;
- 14 (6) student or trainee working under the direct
- 15 supervision of a licensed dietitian for a limited period as
- 16 determined by the dietitians board, while fulfilling an experience
- 17 requirement or pursuing a course of study to meet the requirements
- 18 for a license under this chapter;
- 19 (7) person assisting in the practice of dietetics and
- 20 nutrition care services under the direct supervision of a licensed
- 21 dietitian and performing only support activities; or
- 22 (8) person providing a program of weight control
- 23 services if the program has been reviewed by, consultation is
- 24 available from, and no program change can be initiated without
- 25 <u>prior approval of</u> a:
- 26 (A) dietitian registered by the Commission on
- 27 Dietetic Registration; or

- 1 (B) licensed physician.
- 2 (b) This chapter does not apply to a dietitian or
- 3 <u>nutritionist serving in the United States</u> armed forces or the
- 4 United States Public Health Service or employed by the Department
- 5 of Veterans Affairs when performing duties associated with that
- 6 service or employment.
- 7 (c) This chapter does not apply to a dietitian or
- 8 nutritionist employed by the state or a political subdivision of
- 9 this state, including a school district, who is acting solely
- 10 within the scope of the person's employment.
- 11 Sec. 701.005. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. This chapter
- 12 does not authorize a person to medically diagnose or treat, or to
- 13 attempt to medically diagnose, treat, or cure, a disease, disorder,
- 14 deformity, or injury, or to otherwise engage in the practice of
- 15 medicine in violation of Subtitle B.
- 16 SECTION 5. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 701,
- 17 Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:
- SUBCHAPTER B. TEXAS [STATE] BOARD OF DIETETICS AND NUTRITION
- 19 [EXAMINERS OF DIETITIANS]
- SECTION 6. Section 701.051(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The Texas [State] Board of Dietetics and Nutrition
- 23 [Examiners of Dietitians] consists of nine members appointed by the
- 24 governor with the advice and consent of the senate as follows:
- 25 (1) six licensed dietitian members, each of whom has
- 26 been licensed under this chapter for not less than three years
- 27 before the member's date of appointment; and

- 1 (2) three members who represent the public, including
- 2 one physician.
- 3 SECTION 7. Sections 701.2041(c), (e), (f), (h), and (i),
- 4 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (c) If a person fails to comply with a subpoena, the
- 6 dietitians [dieticians] board, acting through the attorney
- 7 general, may file suit to enforce the subpoena in a district court
- 8 in Travis County or in the county in which a hearing conducted by
- 9 the board may be held.
- 10 (e) The board may delegate the authority granted under
- 11 Subsection (a) to the executive secretary of the <u>dietitians</u>
- 12 [dieticians] board.
- 13 (f) The dietitians [dieticians] board shall pay a
- 14 reasonable fee for photocopies subpoenaed under this section in an
- 15 amount not to exceed the amount the board may charge for copies of
- 16 its records.
- 17 (h) All information and materials subpoenaed or compiled by
- 18 the dietitians [dieticians] board in connection with a complaint
- 19 and investigation are confidential and not subject to disclosure
- 20 under Chapter 552, Government Code, and not subject to disclosure,
- 21 discovery, subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for their
- 22 release to anyone other than the board or its employees or agents
- 23 involved in discipline of the holder of a license, except that this
- 24 information may be disclosed to:
- 25 (1) persons involved with the board in a disciplinary
- 26 action against the holder of a license;
- 27 (2) professional dietitian licensing or disciplinary

- 1 boards in other jurisdictions;
- 2 (3) peer assistance programs approved by the board
- 3 under Chapter 467, Health and Safety Code;
- 4 (4) law enforcement agencies; and
- 5 (5) persons engaged in bona fide research, if all
- 6 individual-identifying information has been deleted.
- 7 (i) The filing of formal charges by the <u>dietitians</u>
- 8 [dieticians] board against a holder of a license, the nature of
- 9 those charges, disciplinary proceedings of the board, and final
- 10 disciplinary actions, including warnings and reprimands, by the
- 11 board are not confidential and are subject to disclosure in
- 12 accordance with Chapter 552, Government Code.
- SECTION 8. Section 701.251(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (b) Unless the person holds \underline{a} [\underline{an} $\underline{appropriate}$] license
- 16 issued under this chapter, a person may not:
- 17 (1) use the title or represent or imply that the person
- 18 has the title "dietitian" ["licensed dietitian"] or "provisional
- 19 licensed dietitian" or use the letters "LD" or "PLD"; [or]
- 20 (2) use a facsimile of those titles or letters to
- 21 indicate or imply that the person is a <u>dietitian</u>, licensed
- 22 dietitian, or provisional licensed dietitian; or
- 23 (3) engage in the practice of dietetics and nutrition
- 24 <u>care services</u>.
- SECTION 9. Section 701.252(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 26 to read as follows:
- 27 (a) Each applicant for a [dietitian] license under this

- 1 chapter must submit a sworn application accompanied by the
- 2 application fee.
- 3 SECTION 10. Sections 701.253(c) and (e), Occupations Code,
- 4 are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (c) The dietitians board shall [prepare or] approve an
- 6 examination administered [. An examination prescribed by the board
- 7 may be or may include an examination given] by the Commission on
- 8 Dietetic Registration $\underline{\text{unless the board finds that the examination}}$
- 9 is inadequate to protect the public health and safety [or by a
- 10 national or state testing service instead of an examination
- 11 prepared by the board].
- 12 (e) Examinations [The dietitians board] shall be
- 13 administered [administer an examination] to qualified applicants
- 14 at least twice each calendar year.
- SECTION 11. Section 701.254, Occupations Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 701.254. QUALIFICATIONS FOR EXAMINATION. (a) To
- 18 qualify for the licensing examination under this chapter, an
- 19 applicant must:
- 20 (1) possess at least a baccalaureate [or
- 21 postbaccalaureate] degree from a United States [, conferred by a
- 22 college or university regionally accredited college or university
- 23 [at the time of conferral,] with[:
- [(A)] a major course of study in human nutrition,
- 25 food and nutrition, nutrition education, dietetics, or food systems
- 26 management; [or
- 27 [(B) an equivalent major course of study approved

- 1 by the dietitians board; and
- 2 (2) have completed <u>a</u> [an internship or preplanned,]
- 3 documented <u>supervised practice</u> [, professional] experience
- 4 component [program] in dietetics [practice] of not less than 900
- 5 hours under the supervision of a licensed dietitian, a
- 6 state-licensed health care practitioner, or an individual with a
- 7 <u>doctoral degree conferred by a regionally accredited college or</u>
- 8 university with a major course of study in human nutrition, food and
- 9 nutrition, nutrition education, dietetics, or food systems
- 10 <u>management</u> [or a registered dietitian approved by the board].
- 11 (b) The supervised practice experience component must be
- 12 completed in the United States.
- 13 (c) The dietitians board shall determine whether a degree
- 14 conferred on an applicant by an educational institution outside of
- 15 the United States is equivalent to a degree conferred by a
- 16 regionally accredited institution of higher education in the United
- 17 States.
- 18 (d) The dietitians board shall determine whether the degree
- 19 of a person who holds a doctoral degree conferred outside the United
- 20 States is equivalent to a doctoral degree conferred by a regionally
- 21 <u>accredited institution of higher education in the United States</u>
- 22 before the person may supervise a practice experience component
- 23 <u>under this section.</u>
- SECTION 12. Section 701.257, Occupations Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- Sec. 701.257. REEXAMINATION FOR LICENSING EXAMINATION. An
- 27 applicant who fails the licensing examination [three times] must

- 1 comply with [provide evidence to the dietitians board that the
- 2 applicant has successfully completed credit hours in the
- 3 applicant's areas of weakness before] the [applicant may apply for]
- 4 reexamination requirements of the entity that administers the
- 5 examination under Section 701.253(c).
- 6 SECTION 13. Section 701.258, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 701.258. QUALIFIED PERSON ENTITLED TO LICENSE. The
- 9 dietitians board shall issue a license under this chapter to a
- 10 person who:
- 11 (1) submits an application under Section 701.252;
- 12 (2) passes the jurisprudence examination under
- 13 <u>Section 701.2575;</u>
- 14 (3) passes the examination under Section 701.253;
- 15 (4) pays the required examination and application
- 16 fees; and
- 17 (5) is otherwise [certificate as a licensed dietitian
- 18 to a person] qualified for a license under this chapter.
- 19 SECTION 14. Subchapter H, Chapter 701, Occupations Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Section 701.354 to read as follows:
- Sec. 701.354. REIMBURSEMENT NOT MANDATED; SERVICES
- 22 AUTHORIZED. (a) This chapter does not require new or additional
- 23 third-party reimbursement or mandated workers' compensation
- 24 benefits for services provided by a license holder under this
- 25 chapter.
- 26 (b) A license holder under this chapter is qualified to
- 27 provide medical nutrition therapy in accordance with 42 U.S.C.

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1 Section 1395x(vv).

- 2 SECTION 15. The following sections of the Occupations Code
- 3 are repealed:
- 4 (1) Section 701.253(d); and
- 5 (2) Section 701.260.
- 6 SECTION 16. The change in law made by this Act by the
- 7 enactment of Section 701.251(b)(3) applies only to the practice of
- 8 dietetics and nutrition care services on or after September 1,
- 9 2009. The practice of dietetics and nutrition care services before
- 10 that date is governed by the law in effect on the date the practice
- 11 occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 12 purpose.
- 13 SECTION 17. The changes in law made by this Act in the
- 14 qualifications of public members of the Texas Board of Dietetics
- 15 and Nutrition do not affect the entitlement of a member serving on
- 16 the board immediately before the effective date of this Act to
- 17 continue to serve for the remainder of the member's term. As the
- 18 terms of board members expire, the governor shall appoint or
- 19 reappoint a member who has the qualifications required for a member
- 20 under Section 701.051(a)(2), Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 21 Act.
- 22 SECTION 18. The changes in law made by this Act by the
- 23 amendment of Sections 701.253 and 701.254, Occupations Code, apply
- 24 only to a person who submits an application for a license under
- 25 Chapter 701, Occupations Code, on or after the effective date of
- 26 this Act. A person who submits an application before the effective
- 27 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the

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- 1 application is submitted, and the former law is continued in effect
- 2 for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 19. The change in law made by this Act by the
- 4 amendment of Section 701.257, Occupations Code, applies only to a
- 5 person who submits an application for reexamination on or after the
- 6 effective date of this Act. A person who submits an application for
- 7 reexamination before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 8 the law in effect on the date the application is submitted, and the
- 9 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 20. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
