## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a statewide initiative to increase
3	independent, affordable housing for elderly or homeless persons and
4	persons with disabilities.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 2306, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter NN to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER NN. TEXAS AFFORDABLE HOUSING INITIATIVE

- 9 Sec. 2306.1081. PURPOSE. The purpose of this subchapter is
- to promote housing independence and prevent unnecessary and 10
- expensive institutionalization of the state's extremely low income 11
- 12 elderly and homeless populations and persons with disabilities.
- 13 Sec. 2306.1082. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 14 (1) "Elderly person" means a person 62 years of age or
- older or of an age specified by the applicable federal program. 15
- (2) "Extremely low income" means a household with a 16
- combined income that is not more than 30 percent of the area median 17
- 18 income or applicable federal poverty line, as determined under
- Section 2306.123 or 2306.1231. 19
- (3) "Initiative plan" means the single unified plan 20
- 21 developed by the task force under Section 2306.1087.
- 22 (4) "Noninstitutionalized housing" means a privately
- 23 owned home, apartment, or group home.
- 24 (5) "Participating agency" means the Texas Department

- 1 of Housing and Community Affairs, the Health and Human Services
- 2 Commission, the Department of State Health Services, the Department
- 3 of Aging and Disability Services, the Public Utility Commission of
- 4 Texas, the Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services, or
- 5 the Office of Rural Community Affairs.
- 6 (6) "Service-enriched housing" means a living
- 7 arrangement that provides health services or social services, or
- 8 both, in an accessible, supportive environment.
- 9 (7) "Task force" means the Texas Affordable Housing
- 10 Initiative Task Force.
- 11 Sec. 2306.1083. ADMINISTRATIVE AND RULEMAKING AUTHORITY.
- 12 (a) A regulatory official has broad authority to administer,
- 13 interpret, and enforce this subchapter.
- 14 (b) A rulemaking authority has broad authority to adopt
- 15 rules to implement this subchapter to carry out the legislature's
- 16 intent.
- 17 Sec. 2306.1084. COMPOSITION OF TASK FORCE. (a) The Texas
- 18 Affordable Housing Initiative Task Force is composed of:
- 19 (1) one representative from each of the following
- 20 agencies, appointed by the head of that agency:
- 21 (A) the Health and Human Services Commission;
- (B) the Department of State Health Services;
- (C) the Department of Aging and Disability
- 24 Services;
- (D) the Department of Assistive and
- 26 Rehabilitative Services;
- 27 (E) the Public Utility Commission of Texas; and

1 (F) the Office of Rural Community Affairs. 2 (2) two representatives from the department, 3 including the director and a person appointed by the director; 4 (3) one member representing advocacy organizations 5 and service providers to homeless persons, appointed by the 6 governor; 7 (4) one member representing advocacy organizations 8 and service providers to elderly persons, appointed by the 9 governor; and 10 (5) one member representing advocacy organizations and service providers to persons with disabilities, appointed by 11 12 the governor. (b) A member of the task force serves at the pleasure of the 13 appointing official or until termination of the member's employment 14 15 or association, as applicable, with the entity the member represents. 16 17 (c) A member of the task force representing a state agency 18 must have: 19 (1) administrative responsibility for programs for homeless or elderly persons or persons with disabilities or related 20 services provided by the agency that the member represents; and 21 (2) authority to make decisions for and commit 22 resources of the agency, subject to the approval of the head of the 23 24 agency or the board of directors of the agency. Sec. 2306.1085. OPERATION OF TASK FORCE. (a) The director 25 26 serves as the presiding officer of the task force.

(b) The task force shall meet at least quarterly.

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- 1 <u>(c)</u> The task force shall keep minutes and records of
- 2 attendance with respect to the meetings of the task force.
- 3 (d) An action taken by the task force must be approved by a
- 4 majority vote of the members present.
- 5 (e) The task force may select and use advisors.
- 6 (f) The department shall provide clerical and advisory
- 7 support staff to the task force.
- 8 (g) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the task force.
- 9 Sec. 2306.1086. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The task force may
- 10 solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations from a public or
- 11 private source for use in carrying out the task force's duties under
- 12 this subchapter.
- Sec. 2306.1087. DUTIES OF TASK FORCE. The task force shall:
- 14 (1) coordinate interdepartmental and interagency
- 15 plans and develop and annually update a unified initiative plan to:
- 16 (A) not later than January 1, 2020, reduce by at
- 17 least 20 percent the <u>number of persons desiring and capable of</u>
- 18 living independently who are compelled to reside in
- 19 Medicaid-supported nursing homes, state institutions, and publicly
- 20 supported homeless shelters by making it possible for those persons
- 21 to remain and live independently in noninstitutionalized housing,
- 22 especially their own homes;
- (B) ensure that the numbers of persons and
- 24 households assisted under programs under this subchapter in each
- 25 uniform state service region are in approximate proportion to the
- 26 numbers of eligible persons and households residing in that uniform
- 27 state service region;

- 1 (C) develop new, more cost-effective programs and strategies to use existing public and private resources to 2 provide housing and reduce the residential energy cost burden on 3 extremely low income homeless or elderly persons or persons with 4 5 disabilities; 6 (D) affirmatively further fair housing 7 opportunities by making available noninstitutionalized housing opportunities to extremely low income homeless or elderly persons 8 or persons with disabilities; and 9 (E) coordinate housing and health services to 10 meet the demands of extremely low income homeless or elderly 11 12 persons or persons with disabilities by promoting service-enriched housing opportunities within a wide range of noninstitutionalized 13 14 housing, including homes currently owned and rented by those 15 persons to the extent possible; 16 (2) determine the programmatic approaches, levels of 17 funding, and funding sources necessary to carry out the initiative 18 plan; 19 (3) research housing needs and programs to achieve the goals of the initiative plan; and 20 21 (4) aggregate, analyze, and report the program initiatives and  $\underline{\text{resource commitments of each participating agency}}$ 22 with respect to activities under the Texas Affordable Housing 23 24 Initiative and certify whether sufficient programs have been initiated and sufficient resources have been committed to meet the 25

- 18 Texas Affordable Housing Initiative Task Force under Section
- 19 2306.1084, Government Code, shall implement the plan enacted, and
- 20 shall take all other actions required to achieve the goals of the
- 21 Texas Affordable Housing Initiative under Subchapter NN, Chapter
- 22 2306, Government Code.
- 23 SECTION 7. Subchapter D, Chapter 161, Human Resources Code,
- 24 is amended by adding Section 161.076 to read as follows:
- 25 <u>Sec. 161.076. COMPLIANCE WITH TEXAS AFFORDABLE HOUSING</u>
- 26 INITIATIVE. The department shall designate a representative to the
- 27 Texas Affordable Housing Initiative Task Force under Section

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- 1 2306.1084, Government Code, shall implement the plan enacted, and
- 2 shall take all other actions required to achieve the goals of the
- 3 Texas Affordable Housing Initiative under Subchapter NN, Chapter
- 4 2306, Government Code.
- 5 SECTION 8. Subchapter A, Chapter 12, Utilities Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 12.006 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 12.006. COMPLIANCE WITH TEXAS AFFORDABLE HOUSING
- 8 INITIATIVE. The commission shall designate a representative to the
- 9 Texas Affordable Housing Initiative Task Force under Section
- 10 2306.1084, Government Code, shall implement the plan enacted, and
- 11 shall take all other actions required to achieve the goals of the
- 12 Texas Affordable Housing Initiative under Subchapter NN, Chapter
- 13 2306, Government Code.
- 14 SECTION 9. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 15 this Act, the governor and the heads of the applicable state
- 16 agencies shall appoint members to the Texas Affordable Housing
- 17 Initiative Task Force in accordance with Subchapter NN, Chapter
- 18 2306, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
