## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to plans and procedures encouraging parental involvement
3	in public schools.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 26, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 26.016 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 26.016. PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT PLAN. (a) Each public
8	school district shall establish a parental involvement plan for
9	each district school that reflects the needs of students and their
10	families. Parents of children enrolled in the district shall be
11	consulted as the district develops the plan.
12	(b) The parental involvement plan for a school shall:
13	(1) involve parents of students at all grade levels in
14	a variety of roles;
15	(2) be comprehensive and coordinated; and
16	(3) recognize that communication between a student's
17	home and school should be regular, two-way, and meaningful.
18	(c) A school shall encourage communication with parents by
19	preparing and distributing age- and grade-appropriate family kits
20	describing:
21	(1) the school's parental involvement plan;
22	(2) the recommended role of the parent, student,
23	teacher, and school;
24	(3) ways for parents to become involved in school and

1 in their childrens' education; 2 (4) activities planned throughout the school year to 3 encourage parental involvement; and 4 (5) a system to allow the parent to communicate with 5 teachers and the principal in a regular, two-way, and meaningful 6 manner. 7 (d) A school shall schedule at least two parent-teacher 8 conferences for each student during a school year. 9 (e) A school shall create a parent center to: 10 (1) welcome parents to the school and provide parental 11 support and assistance; 12 (2) provide access to community resources to strengthen school programs, family practices, and student 13 14 learning; 15 (3) provide parents access to teachers and key school personnel; and 16 17 (4) provide students and parents with a space to build relationships with other students, parents, teachers, and school 18 19 personnel. (f) A school shall aid parents in assisting a student by 20 scheduling regular "Parents Make the Difference" evenings where 21 parents are given a report on the state of the school and an 22 23 overview of: 24 (1) the material students will learn;

(3) what parents should expect for their childrens'

(2) how students will be assessed;

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education; and

1	(4) how parents can assist in their childrens
2	education.
3	(g) A school may not adopt policies or procedures tha
4	discourage a parent from visiting the school, including policies:
5	(1) requiring a parent to pick up a child outside th
6	school building;
7	(2) requiring a parent to present persona
8	identification to gain entrance to the school building; or
9	(3) prohibiting a parent from visiting a child'
10	classroom during school events.
11	(h) A school shall survey parents who want to volunteer i
12	school and determine:
13	(1) what types of volunteer work parents want to do;
14	(2) how frequently a volunteer wants to participate
15	and
16	(3) options for parents who want to volunteer from
17	home.
18	(i) After completing the survey under Subsection (h),
19	school shall publish a volunteer resource book and distribute th
20	book to school employees.
21	(j) A school shall encourage parents to participate in th
22	decisions that affect their children by:
23	(1) routinely publishing the school's procedure fo
24	resolving parental concerns, including how to define the problem
25	who the parent should approach first, and how to develop solutions
26	and

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(2) sponsoring seminars to inform the parents of high

- 1 school students about how to be involved in the decisions affecting
- 2 course selection, career planning, and preparation for
- 3 post-secondary opportunities.
- 4 (k) A school shall take advantage of community resources by:
- 5 (1) contacting alumni from the school and creating an
- 6 alumni advisory commission to provide advice and guidance for
- 7 school improvement;
- 8 (2) developing cards with tips for fostering a child's
- 9 success in school and recruiting local employers to include the
- 10 cards in employee paycheck envelopes; and
- 11 (3) engaging in partnership with institutions of
- 12 higher education located in the community.
- 13 (1) The principal of each school shall designate one
- 14 educator for every 300 students enrolled in the school to serve as a
- 15 parent facilitator to organize meaningful training for staff and
- 16 parents promoting parental involvement in the school and to promote
- 17 parental involvement as an asset to the school. An educator
- 18 designated as a parental facilitator is entitled to receive
- 19 supplemental pay for the assigned duties.
- 20 (m) The State Board for Educator Certification shall
- 21 require at least two hours each year of continuing education for
- 22 educators other than administrators designed to enhance
- 23 <u>understanding of effective parental involvement strategies.</u>
- 24 (n) The State Board for Educator Certification shall
- 25 require at least three hours each year of continuing education for
- 26 administrators to enhance understanding of effective parental
- 27 involvement strategies and the importance of administrative

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- 1 leadership in setting expectations and creating a climate conducive
- 2 to parental participation.
- 3 (o) Each school district shall review and update the
- 4 district's parental involvement plan each school year and file a
- 5 copy of the plan with the agency. The agency shall review each
- 6 parental involvement plan for compliance with this section. The
- 7 agency shall send written notification to a district whose plan is
- 8 not in compliance with Subsection (a) and shall allow the district
- 9 an opportunity to correct its plan.
- 10 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 11 of this Act, a school district shall adopt a parental involvement
- 12 plan as required by Section 26.016, Education Code, as added by this
- 13 Act.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
