A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to establishing a pilot program for certain students at
- 3 risk of dropping out of school.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 29.0961 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 29.0961. DROPOUT PREVENTION PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The
- 8 commissioner by rule shall establish a pilot program under which
- 9 participating school districts implement a dropout prevention
- 10 program for students in grade six.
- 11 (b) A school district may apply to the commissioner to
- 12 participate in the pilot program. Subject to receipt of acceptable
- 13 applications, the commissioner shall select school districts for
- 14 participation in the pilot program. An application by a school
- 15 district must describe the manner in which the pilot program will be
- 16 implemented in the school district, including specific, measurable
- 17 performance indicators through which the school district will
- 18 demonstrate the effectiveness of the program in reducing dropout
- 19 <u>rates.</u>
- 20 <u>(c) A school district participating in the pilot program</u>
- 21 shall implement intervention models that include best practices
- 22 for preventing students from dropping out of school as determined
- 23 by the agency and by the best practices clearinghouse under Section
- 24 7.009. A district must provide students participating in the

- 1 program with academic mentoring.
- 2 (d) A school district participating in the pilot program
- 3 shall provide an annual progress report to the agency not later than
- 4 August 1 of each year the district is participating in the pilot
- 5 program. The report must state in detail the type of intervention
- 6 model used in the district and the effect of the pilot program on
- 7 the district, including:
- 8 (1) any effect on the academic progress of students
- 9 who are participating in a pilot program, as measured by
- 10 performance on assessment instruments, including assessment
- 11 instruments administered under Section 39.023;
- 12 (2) a comparison of student progress at a campus or in
- 13 a classroom in the school district that is participating in the
- 14 pilot program as compared to student progress at a campus or in a
- 15 classroom in a district that is not participating in the pilot
- 16 program;
- 17 (3) any effect on student attendance or dropout rates;
- 18 and
- 19 (4) any effect on student enrollment in high school.
- 20 (e) A pilot program shall continue to monitor the
- 21 educational career and success of a student enrolled in the pilot
- 22 program for six years from the date the student enrolls in the
- 23 program. If a student enrolled in the pilot program transfers to
- 24 another school district in this state, the district to which the
- 25 student transfers shall provide the district participating in the
- 26 pilot program information to enable the district to monitor the
- 27 student's progress. A pilot program must include research and the

- 1 district must conduct a relational study that evaluates the
- 2 relationship between the measures implemented through the pilot
- 3 program and dropout rates in the district.
- 4 (f) The agency shall provide technical assistance to a
- 5 school district participating in the pilot program, including
- 6 assisting the district in researching the effectiveness of the
- 7 program.
- 8 <u>(g)</u> The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to
- 9 implement this section.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 11 school year.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
