H.B. No. 3670

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of the practice of dental assistants, including the delegation of certain dental acts. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 258.002(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 (a) A licensed dentist may delegate to a qualified and 7 trained dental assistant acting under the dentist's general or 8 9 direct supervision any dental act that a reasonable and prudent dentist would find is within the scope of sound dental judgment to 10 11 delegate if: in the opinion of the delegating dentist, the act: 12 (1)13 (A) can be properly and safely performed by the person to whom the dental act is delegated; and 14 (B) is performed in a customary manner and is not 15 16 in violation of this subtitle or any other statute; [and] (2) the person to whom the dental act is delegated does 17 not represent to the public that the person is authorized to 18 19 practice dentistry; and 20 (3) the person to whom the dental act is delegated 21 holds the appropriate certificate, if a certificate is required to perform the act. 22 SECTION 2. Chapter 265, Occupations Code, is amended by 23

adding Section 265.0001 to read as follows:

1	Sec. 265.0001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
2	(1) "Coronal polishing" means the removal of plaque
3	and extrinsic stain from exposed natural and restored tooth
4	surfaces using an appropriate rotary instrument with rubber cup or
5	brush and polishing agent, including the use of a toothbrush.
6	(2) "Interim treatment of a minor emergency dental
7	condition" means treatment of a condition that:
8	(A) arises unexpectedly;
9	(B) causes pain or discomfort to the patient;
10	(C) is considered reversible;
11	(D) does not require cutting hard or soft tissue;
12	and
13	(E) in the opinion of the treating dentist, may
14	be performed by a properly trained dental assistant.
15	SECTION 3. Section 265.002, Occupations Code, is amended to
16	read as follows:
17	Sec. 265.002. SUPERVISION, DIRECTION, AND RESPONSIBILITY.
18	(a) In this subtitle, a dental assistant is under the direct
19	supervision, direction, and responsibility of a dentist if the
20	dentist:
21	(1) employs the dental assistant or is in charge of the
22	dental assistant; and
23	(2) is physically present in the dental office when
24	the dental assistant performs a delegated dental act.
25	(b) For purposes of Subsection (a)(2), physical presence
26	does not require that the supervising dentist be in the treatment
27	room when the dental assistant performs the service as long as the

1 dentist is in the dental office. (c) In this subtitle, a dental assistant is under the 2 general supervision, direction, and responsibility of a dentist if 3 4 the dentist: 5 (1) employs the dental assistant or is in charge of the dental assistant; and 6 7 (2) is responsible for supervising the services to be 8 performed by the dental assistant. SECTION 4. Section 265.003, Occupations Code, is amended to 9 read as follows: 10 Sec. 265.003. PERMITTED DUTIES. (a) A dental assistant who 11 12 is not professionally licensed may [+ [(1)] be employed by and work in the office of a 13 14 licensed and practicing dentist [+] and 15 [(2)] perform one or more delegated dental acts under: 16 (1) the direct supervision, direction, and 17 responsibility of the dentist, including: (A) the application of a pit and fissure sealant; 18 (B) coronal polishing, if the dental assistant 19 holds a certificate under Section 265.006; and 20 21 (C) the application of fluoride varnish; or 2.2 (2) the general supervision, direction, and responsibility of the dentist, limited to: 23 24 (A) the making of dental x-rays in compliance with Section 265.005; and 25 26 (B) the provision of interim treatment of a minor emergency dental condition to an existing patient of the treating 27

1	dentist.
2	(a-1) A treating dentist who delegates the provision of
3	interim treatment of a minor emergency dental condition to a dental
4	assistant under Subsection (a)(2)(B) shall:
5	(1) delegate the procedure orally or in writing before
6	the dental assistant performs the procedure;
7	(2) retain responsibility for the procedure; and
8	(3) schedule a follow-up appointment with the patient
9	within a reasonable time.
10	(b) A dental assistant <u>who applies</u> [may apply] a pit and
11	fissure sealant under Subsection (a) may cleanse the occlusal and
12	smooth surfaces of the teeth immediately before and for the sole
13	purpose of preparing the tooth area for the placement of the pit and
14	fissure sealant or orthodontic bonding resin. A procedure
15	performed by a dental assistant under this subsection may not be
16	billed as a prophylaxis [only if:
17	[(1) the assistant is certified to apply a pit and
18	fissure sealant under Section 265.004; and
19	[(2) the dentist described by Subsection (a):
20	[(A) is a Medicaid provider; or
21	[(B) practices in an area determined to be
22	underserved by the Texas Department of Health].
23	SECTION 5. Section 265.004(b), Occupations Code, is amended
24	to read as follows:
25	(b) To qualify for a certificate, an applicant must:
26	(1) have at least two years' experience as a dental
27	assistant; and

1 (2) have successfully completed a minimum of <u>eight</u> 2 [16] hours of clinical and didactic education in pit and fissure 3 sealants taken through an accredited dental hygiene program or a 4 dental assisting program accredited by the Commission on Dental 5 Accreditation of the American Dental Association and approved by 6 the board.

7 SECTION 6. Chapter 265, Occupations Code, is amended by 8 adding Section 265.006 to read as follows:

9 <u>Sec. 265.006. CORONAL POLISHING CERTIFICATE.</u> (a) The 10 <u>board shall issue a coronal polishing certificate to a dental</u> 11 <u>assistant who qualifies under this section.</u>

12 (b) To qualify for a coronal polishing certificate, an 13 applicant must have at least two years' experience as a dental 14 assistant and:

15 <u>(1) have successfully completed at least eight hours</u> 16 <u>of clinical and didactic education in coronal polishing taken</u> 17 <u>through a dental assisting program accredited by the Commission on</u> 18 <u>Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association and</u> 19 <u>approved by the board that includes courses on:</u>

20 (A) oral anatomy and tooth morphology relating to
21 retention of plaque and stain;
22 (B) indications, contraindications, and

(B) indications, contraindications, and
complications of coronal polishing;
(C) principles of coronal polishing, including

25 <u>armamentarium, operator and patient positioning, technique, and</u> 26 polishing agents;

(D) infection control procedures;

1	(E) polishing coronal surfaces of teeth; and
2	(F) jurisprudence relating to coronal polishing;
3	or
4	(2) present proof to the board that the assistant has:
5	(A) graduated from a dental assisting program
6	accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the
7	American Dental Association and approved by the board that includes
8	specific didactic course work and clinical training in coronal
9	polishing; or
10	(B) received certification of completion of
11	requirements specified by the Dental Assisting National Board and
12	approved by the board.
13	SECTION 7. Chapter 265, Occupations Code, is amended by
14	adding Section 265.007 to read as follows:
15	Sec. 265.007. CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR CERTIFICATE
16	HOLDERS. (a) To renew a certificate issued under this chapter, a
17	dental assistant must complete six hours of continuing education
18	each year in areas covering dental assistant duties.
19	(b) A dental assistant holding two or more certificates
20	authorized by this chapter must complete 12 hours of continuing
21	education each year to renew all of the certificates held by the
22	assistant.
23	(c) A dental assistant may fulfill continuing education
24	requirements through board-approved self-study, interactive
25	computer courses, or lecture courses.
26	SECTION 8. The following sections of the Occupations Code
27	are repealed:

(1) Section 258.002(b);

(2) Section 265.004(d); and

(3) Sections 265.005(j) and (k).

SECTION 9. The change in law made by this Act to Section 5 265.004(b), Occupations Code, applies only to an application for a 6 pit and fissure sealant certificate under that section that is 7 filed on or after the effective date of this Act. An application 8 filed before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date 9 the application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect 10 for that purpose.

SECTION 10. The change in law made by this Act by the 11 enactment of Section 265.007, Occupations Code, applies to a 12 certificate issued under Chapter 265, Occupations Code, that 13 expires on or after the effective date of this Act. A holder of a 14 15 certificate issued under that chapter that expires before the 16 effective date of this Act may renew that certificate by complying with the law in effect at the time the certificate was issued, and 17 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 18

19 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
