A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the regulation of the practice of dental assistants,
- 3 including the delegation of certain dental acts.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 258.002(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A licensed dentist may delegate to a qualified and
- 8 trained dental assistant acting under the dentist's general or
- 9 direct supervision any dental act that a reasonable and prudent
- 10 dentist would find is within the scope of sound dental judgment to
- 11 delegate if:
- 12 (1) in the opinion of the delegating dentist, the act:
- (A) can be properly and safely performed by the
- 14 person to whom the dental act is delegated; and
- 15 (B) is performed in a customary manner and is not
- 16 in violation of this subtitle or any other statute; [and]
- 17 (2) the person to whom the dental act is delegated does
- 18 not represent to the public that the person is authorized to
- 19 practice dentistry; and
- 20 (3) the person to whom the dental act is delegated
- 21 holds the appropriate certificate, if a certificate is required to
- 22 perform the act.
- 23 SECTION 2. Chapter 265, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 24 adding Section 265.0001 to read as follows:

- C.S.H.B. No. 3670 1 Sec. 265.0001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 2 "Coronal polishing" means the removal of plaque and extrinsic stain from exposed natural and restored tooth 3 surfaces using an appropriate rotary instrument with rubber cup or 4 brush and polishing agent, including the use of a toothbrush. 5 6 (2) "Interim treatment of a minor emergency dental 7 condition" means treatment of a condition that: 8 (A) arises unexpectedly; 9 (B) causes pain or discomfort to the patient; 10 (C) is considered reversible; 11 (D) does not require cutting hard or soft tissue; 12 and (E) in the opinion of the treating dentist, may 13 be performed by a properly trained dental assistant. 14 15 SECTION 3. Section 265.002, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 16 Sec. 265.002. SUPERVISION, DIRECTION, AND RESPONSIBILITY. 17 In this subtitle, a dental assistant is under the direct 18 (a) 19 supervision, direction, and responsibility of a dentist if the dentist: 20
- 21 (1) employs the dental assistant or is in charge of the
- 22 dental assistant; and
- 23 (2) is physically present in the dental office when
- 24 the dental assistant performs a delegated dental act.
- 25 (b) For purposes of Subsection (a)(2), physical presence
- 26 does not require that the supervising dentist be in the treatment
- 27 room when the dental assistant performs the service as long as the

- 1 dentist is in the dental office.
 2 (c) In this subtitle,
- 2 (c) In this subtitle, a dental assistant is under the
- 3 general supervision, direction, and responsibility of a dentist if
- 4 the dentist:
- 5 (1) employs the dental assistant or is in charge of the
- 6 dental assistant; and
- 7 (2) is responsible for supervising the services to be
- 8 performed by the dental assistant.
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 265.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 265.003. PERMITTED DUTIES. (a) A dental assistant who
- 12 is not professionally licensed may[+
- 13 $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$ be employed by and work in the office of a
- 14 licensed and practicing dentist[+] and
- 15 $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ perform one or more delegated dental acts under:
- 16 (1) the direct supervision, direction, and
- 17 responsibility of the dentist, including:
- 18 (A) the application of a pit and fissure sealant;
- 19 (B) coronal polishing, if the dental assistant
- 20 holds a certificate under Section 265.006; and
- 21 <u>(C)</u> the application of fluoride; or
- 22 (2) the general supervision, direction, and
- 23 <u>responsibility of the dentist, limited to:</u>
- 24 (A) the making of dental x-rays in compliance
- 25 with Section 265.005; and
- 26 (B) the provision of interim treatment of a minor
- 27 emergency dental condition to an existing patient of the treating

1 <u>dentist</u>. 2 (a-1) A treating dentist who delegates the provision of interim treatment of a minor emergency dental condition to a dental 3 assistant under Subsection (a)(2)(B) shall: 4 5 (1) delegate the procedure orally or in writing before 6 the dental assistant performs the procedure; 7 (2) retain responsibility for the procedure; and 8 (3) schedule a follow-up appointment with the patient within a reasonable time. 9 (b) A dental assistant who applies [may apply] a pit and 10 fissure sealant under Subsection (a) may cleanse the occlusal and 11 smooth surfaces of the teeth immediately before and for the sole 12 purpose of preparing the tooth area for the placement of the pit and 13 fissure sealant or orthodontic bonding resin. A procedure 14 performed by a dental assistant under this subsection may not be 15 billed as a prophylaxis [only if: 16 [(1) the assistant is certified to apply a pit and 17 fissure sealant under Section 265.004; and 18 19 [(2) the dentist described by Subsection (a): [(A) is a Medicaid provider; or 20 21 [(B) practices in an area determined to underserved by the Texas Department of Health].

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SECTION 5. Section 265.004(b), Occupations Code, is amended

- 7 SECTION 6. Chapter 265, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 8 adding Section 265.006 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 265.006. CORONAL POLISHING CERTIFICATE. (a) The board
- 10 shall issue a coronal polishing certificate to a dental assistant
- 11 who qualifies under this section.
- 12 <u>(b) To qualify for a coronal polishing certificate, an</u>
- 13 applicant must have at least two years' experience as a dental
- 14 assistant and:
- 15 (1) have successfully completed at least 12 hours of
- 16 clinical and didactic education in coronal polishing taken through
- 17 a dental assisting program accredited by the Commission on Dental
- 18 Accreditation of the American Dental Association and approved by
- 19 the board that includes courses on:
- 20 (A) oral anatomy and tooth morphology relating to
- 21 retention of plaque and stain;
- (B) indications, contraindications, and
- 23 <u>complications of coronal polishing;</u>
- (C) principles of coronal polishing, including
- 25 armamentarium, operator and patient positioning, technique, and
- 26 polishing agents;
- 27 (D) infection control procedures;

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1	(E) polishing coronal surfaces of teeth; and
2	(F) jurisprudence relating to coronal polishing;
3	or
4	(2) present proof to the board that the assistant has:
5	(A) graduated from a dental assisting program
6	accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the
7	American Dental Association and approved by the board that includes
8	specific didactic course work and clinical training in coronal
9	polishing; or
10	(B) received certification of completion of
11	requirements specified by the Dental Assisting National Board and
12	approved by the board.
13	SECTION 7. Chapter 265, Occupations Code, is amended by
14	adding Section 265.007 to read as follows:
15	Sec. 265.007. CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR CERTIFICATE
16	HOLDERS. (a) To renew a certificate issued under this chapter, a
17	dental assistant must complete six hours of continuing education

(b) A dental assistant holding two or more certificates

each year in areas covering dental assistant duties.

- 20 authorized by this chapter must complete 12 hours of continuing
- 21 <u>education each year to renew all of the certificates held by the</u>
- 22 assistant.

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- 23 <u>(c) A dental assistant may fulfill continuing education</u>
- 24 requirements through board-approved self-study, interactive
- 25 <u>computer courses</u>, or <u>lecture courses</u>.
- 26 SECTION 8. The following sections of the Occupations Code
- 27 are repealed:

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- 1 (1) Section 258.002(b);
- 2 (2) Section 265.004(d); and
- 3 (3) Sections 265.005(j) and (k).
- SECTION 9. The change in law made by this Act to Section 265.004(b), Occupations Code, applies only to an application for a pit and fissure sealant certificate under that section that is filed on or after the effective date of this Act. An application
- 8 filed before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date
- Tired service that adde is governed significantly the first date
- 9 the application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect
- 10 for that purpose.
- 11 SECTION 10. The change in law made by this Act by the
- 12 enactment of Section 265.007, Occupations Code, applies to a
- 13 certificate issued under Chapter 265, Occupations Code, that
- 14 expires on or after the effective date of this Act. A holder of a
- 15 certificate issued under that chapter that expires before the
- 16 effective date of this Act may renew that certificate by complying
- 17 with the law in effect at the time the certificate was issued, and
- 18 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
