15	removal, that are related to the Barnett Shale in this state and the
16	Haynesville Shale in Louisiana.
17	(b) A grant awarded under this section may be paid from any
18	source available for that purpose, including:

- 2 comptroller under Section 403.351 must provide that:

- 6 <u>and</u>
- 7 (2) a county that receives a grant may use the grant
- 8 only to repair the significant damage caused by the natural gas
- 9 activities.
- Sec. 403.353. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. Not later than
- 11 December 1 of each even-numbered year, the comptroller shall submit
- 12 a report to the legislature summarizing the activities of the
- 13 comptroller under this subchapter.
