C.S.H.B. No. 3795

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the public awareness campaign promoting higher
3 education.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 61.9701(a), Education Code, is amended
6 to read as follows:

7 (a) The board, in conjunction with the Texas Education
8 Agency, shall establish a statewide public awareness campaign to
9 promote the value and availability of higher education.

10 SECTION 2. Sections 61.9702 and 61.9703, Education Code,
11 are amended to read as follows:

12 Sec. 61.9702. TARGET AUDIENCE. (a) The campaign
13 established by the board must target [~~primary and secondary school~~]
14 students in the 7th through 12th grade levels.

15 (b) The board shall give priority to reaching [~~primary and~~
16 ~~secondary school~~] students from groups or backgrounds that are
17 traditionally underrepresented in higher education, especially
18 students who are educationally disadvantaged, as defined by Section
19 5.001.

20 Sec. 61.9703. COORDINATION WITH OTHER ENTITIES [~~AGENCIES~~].
21 The board shall [~~may~~] coordinate with the Texas Education Agency,
22 the P-16 Council established under Section 61.076, and other
23 appropriate entities, including businesses, [~~other agencies as~~
24 ~~necessary~~] to develop and implement the public awareness campaign

1 in order to send a strong message concerning the importance of
2 higher education.

3 SECTION 3. Subchapter CC, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
4 amended by adding Section 61.97031 to read as follows:

5 Sec. 61.97031. CAMPAIGN DESIGN CRITERIA. The board, in
6 conjunction with those entities with which the board coordinates
7 under Section 61.9703, shall:

8 (1) annually hold meetings of students described by
9 Section 61.9702 and their parents, at locations likely to be easily
10 accessible to them, to explain:

11 (A) financial aid opportunities that may make
12 attending an institution of higher education affordable;

13 (B) the reasons that higher education is
14 important; and

15 (C) secondary education courses that may help to
16 prepare students to succeed at institutions of higher education;
17 and

18 (2) develop support mechanisms for parents of students
19 described by Section 61.9702 to:

20 (A) assist the parents with understanding and
21 completing the free application for federal student aid (FAFSA);
22 and

23 (B) familiarize the parents with the actions
24 necessary for students to be prepared for, apply to, and attend
25 institutions of higher education.

26 SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 56, Education Code, is
27 amended by adding Section 56.005 to read as follows:

1 Sec. 56.005. ADDITIONAL STUDENT FINANCIAL AID PROGRAM. The
2 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in consultation with the
3 Texas Education Agency, shall develop a plan for a student
4 financial aid program designed:

5 (1) to provide financial aid in addition to:

6 (A) any aid provided under other state financial
7 aid programs;

8 (B) any aid provided under federal financial aid
9 programs; and

10 (C) any contributions from parents; and

11 (2) to provide financial aid to students who:

12 (A) have met the curriculum requirements for the
13 recommended or advanced high school program as determined under
14 Section 28.025; and

15 (B) have not been convicted of a criminal offense
16 or found under Section 54.03, Family Code, to have engaged in
17 delinquent conduct or conduct indicating a need for supervision.

18 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
22 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
